

BOYS DIVISION COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER & PREP ALUMNUS, LARRY BALONE, EMBRACES BROTHERHOOD OF ST. MARY'S

Excerpt from his Commencement speech to the Boys Division Class of 2024:

"... Soon, you will all be starting your new roles as students, or in your careers and in service. You, being men of St Mary's, you're charismatic, magnetic, confident, and fun. I remember that feeling well. Mostly, because I woke up feeling that way this morning. Exuding that confidence or I guess in my case arrogance, people are going to look to you and expect you to have it all figured out. At some point, I did confuse being a man of St Mary's to simply being the "man". I wouldn't admit that I didn't have all the answers. Because of this lack of vulnerability, I missed the opportunity to discover some important revelations about myself and ultimately delayed my chance to find my true passion.

I wanted someone else's version of success for myself. I plowed forward to become a stockbroker because it held enough clout to let everyone know I was the man. I ignored plenty of signs around me that I wasn't pursuing my passion. I mean, I ended up with a second degree because I always paired a Psychology class that I loved whenever I was "forced" to take an Economics class (it was my major so I was forced to take economics every semester - that's kind of how that works). After




graduation, I got a high paying job with the company I had interned with. Struggle came in the form of 350 cold calls per day and I just didn't have the passion to make sense of that so, within months, I left.

What I learned from this lesson is I didn't have enough conviction to follow my own vision of success. And if I am being honest, I wasn't totally clear on what passion was and how to go about discovering it. I knew this much: chasing money, titles and the admiration of others was exhausting and defeating. And I knew that I was going to have to shift my mindset if I was going to be happy. After I came to terms with that, the process of discovering passion was simple and really a lot of fun. All you have to do is gather as many unique experiences as you can and form deep and meaningful relationships with the people around you. No. There is not a universal definition for passion. But like most matters of the heart, I can tell you by feeling. When you work on and in your passion, you should enter a flow. When you encounter hours of hard work and tons of problems to solve, you'll enjoy the grind. Trust me when I tell you that the pursuit of passion is fun and really makes for a life worth living . . .

... After that you can apply the hard work, creativity, focus, persistence, talents, all those things I know you know how to do and literally become unstoppable ... If this all sounds like a lot and you feel pressure. . . bring yourself to the present and enjoy what's right in front of you. Understand that you literally have no control over those future outcomes, so just relax. You can really only control your behaviors, your actions and how you respond, that's it, the outcomes are up to God. This is your faith in practice.

Class of 2024, thank you for providing me with one of the great honors of my life. Go forward and be great with the support we all have from God, Family and St. Mary's.

After six years of dedicated service leading Orchard Lake St. Mary's Preparatory, Mr. Bob Pyles will retire as Headmaster, concluding his more than 40-year career in education. Mr. Pyles will take on a special advisory role dedicated to the transition and strategic planning with the Orchard Lake Schools administration. After notifying Orchard Lake Schools administration early this year, Mr. Pyles made his decision public Tuesday by announcing it to faculty and staff.

The Orchard Lake Schools Board of Regents and St Mary's Preparatory Board of Trustees have completed a comprehensive process to select a new Headmaster. St Mary's Preparatory is excited to announce today that the Board of Regents and Trustees have unanimously selected Mr. Leonard Karschnia as the next Headmaster.

Mr. Pyles, who assumed the role of St. Mary's Headmaster in the 2018-2019 school year, has left an indelible mark on the institution. His tenure was characterized by significant achievements, notably the successful implementation of the co-divisional model. The Girls Division, which saw its inaugural class graduate this May, has maintained a waiting list for enrollment since its inception, while the Boys Division has experienced a substantial increase in enrollment. Under his leadership and vision, the school underwent remarkable changes, including renovating the historic Prep classroom building, a new technology interface for students in every classroom, repurposing and redesigning buildings (library) to reduce class sizes, and the main campus Quad restoration. Additionally, the Burkacki Academic Center, a new 20-classroom building on the shores of Orchard Lake, was constructed and opened.

"We are indebted to Bob Pyles", says Todd Covert, Vice Chancellor & Chief Operating Officer of the Orchard Lake Schools. "This has not been an easy era to lead schools, let alone increase enrollment from 480 students to over 900 in just the past four years. His wisdom, courage, and experience have given us the engine we need not just to survive but to thrive in the future. We are incredibly grateful for his unwavering leadership, commitment, and dedication to our institution and for helping to shape the future of education of both the Boys and Girls Divisions."

For the past 32 years, our new Headmaster, Mr. Karschnia, has been well-known to the St. Mary's community as a passionate teacher, Coach, and administrator. Most recently, he has served as Vice Headmaster for the past four years.

"Mr. Karschnia is the perfect choice to succeed Mr. Pyles", says Covert. "Bob created and executed a plan to keep our school strong for the next century, and Len played a significant role in that process. Len's three decades of experience in education, administration, and leadership will allow St. Mary's to continue being a prominent Roman Catholic institution. His love for St Mary's and our tradition is unmatched in every way. He has dedicated his entire professional life to Catholic education at Orchard Lake."

Mr. Karschnia is an Honorary Alumnus of the Orchard Lake Schools. He and his wife Michelle of 32 years, reside in St. Clair Shores and have two children: his son Albert, a 2011 graduate of St. Mary's and the University of Michigan ('15), and his daughter Veronica, a graduate of Regina High School ('16) and Carnegie Institute.



💉 ST. JOHN PAUL II LITURGICAL CENTER UPDATE

As May is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, so June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus simply because the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is celebrated mainly this month. In 1673, St. Margaret Mary Alacoque received the first vision of Jesus who told her: "My Divine Heart is so passionately in love with humanity that it can no longer contain within itself the flames of its ardent love. It must pour them out. I have chosen you for this great plan". In 1675, Jesus told her that He wanted the Feast of the Sacred Heart to be celebrated on the Friday after the Corpus Christi octave. In 1856, the Feast of the Sacred Heart became a universal feast. We celebrate this moveable feast this year on June 7.

St. John Paul II was a great devotee of the Sacred Heart. In 1999, he wrote a letter to commemorate the 100th Anniversary of the Consecration of the Human Race to the Divine Heart of

Jesus by Pope Leo XIII, where we read the following below.



IN THE WORDS OF ST. JOHN PAUL II:

The consecration of the human race to the Heart of Jesus was thus presented by Leo XIII as "the summit and crowning of all the honours which have been customarily paid to the Most Sacred Heart" (Annum sacrum, p. 72). Such a consecration, the Encyclical explains, is owed to Christ, Redeemer of the human race, for what he is in himself and for what he has done for human beings. Since in the Sacred Heart the believer encounters the symbol and the living image of the infinite love of Christ, which in itself spurs us to love one another, he cannot fail to recognize the need to participate personally in the work of salvation. For this reason, every member of the Church is invited to see consecration as the giving and binding of oneself to Jesus Christ, the King "of prodigal sons", the King of all who are waiting to be led "into the light of God and of his kingdom" (Formula of Consecration). Consecration thus understood is to be joined to the missionary activity of the Church herself, because it answers the desire of Jesus'

Heart to propagate in the world, through the members of his Body, his total dedication to the kingdom, and to unite the Church ever more closely to his offering to the Father and his being for others . . .

I wish to express my approval and encouragement to all who in any way continue to foster, study, and promote devotion to the Heart of Christ in the Church with language and forms adapted to our times, so that it may be transmitted to future generations in the spirit which has always animated it. The faithful still need to be guided to contemplate adoringly the mystery of Christ, the God-Man, in order to become men and women of interior life, people who feel and live the call to new life, to holiness, to reparation which is apostolic cooperation in the salvation of the world, people who prepare themselves for the new evangelization, recognizing the Heart of Christ as the heart of the Church: it is urgent for the world to understand that Christianity is the religion of love.

The Saviour's Heart invites us to return to the Father's love, which is the source of every authentic love: "In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the expiation for our sins" (1 Jn 4:10). Jesus ceaselessly receives from the Father, rich in mercy and compassion, the love which he lavishes upon human beings (cf. Eph 2:4; Jas 5:11). His Heart particularly reveals the generosity of God towards sinners. God's reaction to sin is not to lessen his love, but to expand it into a flow of mercy which becomes the initiative of the Redemption.

POLISH INSTITUTE UPDATE

MEMORIAL DAY AND THE POLISH AMERICANS

They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old: Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning We will remember them.

"For the Fallen" by Laurence Binyon

Memorial Day is the American holiday to honor those men and women who died defending their country. It began as Decoration Day in 1868 when veterans of the Union Army decorated the graves of their comrades who had died in the Civil War with flowers and flags. After World War I and World War II, it became a universal American holiday to honor war dead.

For Polish immigrants and their descendants, Memorial Day became an important day not only to remember their own sons, brothers, fathers, and husbands who had fallen in battle but to signal their unbreakable bond to their new homeland. During World War I, 22,000 Polish Americans served in the Polish Blue Army under Gen. Józef Haller, but many more served in the American armed forces. At



a time when Poles were viewed as second-class citizens and were often relegated to the lowest-paying jobs, the service and sacrifice of Polish American veterans was an important way to demonstrate their love and loyalty to their adopted country.

That love and loyalty was demonstrated as never before during World War II. The demographic profile of Polish immigration to America meant that many immigrants had started families between 1915 and 1925, resulting in huge spike in births among Polish families in America in the early 1920s. This resulted in rapid growth of Polish parishes and parochial school enrollment, but it also meant that when the Japanese attacked Pearl



Harbor and America entered World War II, an unprecedented number of Polonia's youth were ready and willing to join the Armed Forces. According to figures of the U.S. Census, a higher percentage of Polish Americans served in World War II than any other ethnic and racial group tracked by the Census.

In some Polish parishes, as many as forty percent of all parishioners were serving in the Armed Forces by 1945. Poles continued to serve in significant numbers in the Korean War and in Vietnam. In these conflicts many tens of thousands of Polish Americans lost their lives in service to the United States. With both pride and

sorrow, Polish families, parishes, and organizations displayed service flags. These flags had a blue star for each member in the armed forces and a gold star for those who would never return home.

In many Polish American parishes, one of the most important organizations to emerge during World War II were groups of Gold Star and Blue Star Mothers. In his history of St. Florian Parish in Hamtramck, the late Dr. T. C. Radzilowski wrote "the Gold Star in the window became a new symbol of bereavement and a call for Christian consolation from relatives, neighbors, and priests. Everyone shared the anxious daily wait for the mail. Blue Star Mothers, those with sons or daughters in the armed forces, became the new group in the parish who undertook the knitting of warm socks, preparation of packages for shipment to those serving abroad and the preparation of bandages."

Memorial Day in Polonia was never just a day off work or a time to enjoy cookouts in the backyard. In communities like Hamtramck that held an annual Memorial Day parade for many years, remembrance of the fallen took precedence over celebration and Mass attendance was almost obligatory.

Memorial Day in Polonia is both reminder of the cost of freedom and the fact that the sacrifice of so many young Polish Americans demonstrated that their place in American society was earned not given.
