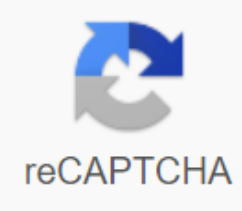

Beginning sounds activities pdf

Growing a book on the book is the inspiration for this week's Share It Saturday features. I'm in love with her Beginning Sounds of Pancakes, so I thought I'd put together some more ideas that help teach start sounds and get kids excited to learn letters. Are you following Fun-A-Day's BALANCED LITERACY Pinterest board? The ability to distinguish sounds from each other in oral language is called sound discrimination. Hearing the first sound in words is one aspect of sonic discrimination, and it is an important early literacy skill for children. It helps them pay attention to the sounds they hear and it helps them in learning the letter sounds in the future. One easy way to integrate this is in my preschool class when I call the kids for activities. For example, when I want children to line up to go outside, I can say: If your name starts as a house, you can queue up. What's the sound at the beginning of the house? Yes! It's /h/. Then the kids will help me determine who can get in line! It's super simple, but kiddos usually like it. Most of the ideas below share ways to link the beginning sounds of letters. So they have ways to take sound discrimination to the next step by linking oral language to written language. In Pre-K and kindergarten we work hard studying the letters of the alphabet and we really want to become great readers! We start with the skill of letter recognition, as well as working on the sounds of letters! Finding fun, effective early literacy can be a challenge, but not today! I'm happy to share with you these start sound activities and hubs! Your students will practice the beginning of sounds with a variety of fun, practical activities! Start up The centers of these activities are suitable for pre-K and kindergarten students. You can use them in small groups, centers or for affiliate work! Here's a peek at some of the amazing activities you'll get! Bubble Gum Match Select gumball will start a sound picture card and match it with its matching gumball machine letter. You can put this in the center and the students only work on a few letter sounds at a time. Kids can work with a partner and place the beginning of a sound gumball picture card in a drawstring bag and take turns choosing a card and placing them the correct beginning of the sound gumball machine. Magnet Match Using magnets or letter tiles to place on top of the photo, identifying their top sounds. Place the magnet mat on top of the cookie sheet to make sure the letters stick. This adds an extra layer of fun for the kids! This activity is ideal for the activity of the center. We like that it also runs a fine muscle engine too! Pop! That sound! Children will work independently or in pairs to hide photos that match the top sound of the letter on a bowl of popcorn. Give the kids popcorn to cover up the top of the audio images or use a little manipulative if you don't want to use the food. Partners can work together or turn it into a race! They can see who can cover their popcorn cards first! Alpha Crunch Students will work alone or with a partner to trace the letters of the alphabet that match the top sound cookies! This activity is ideal as a central activity. Place a shoelace bag or basket in the center. Children will pull out the top of the sound card image of the cookie, and say the name of the picture, as well as what the sound picture begins with. Using a pencil, colored pencil or marker, students will track the letter that the beginning of the sound card coincides. What else is on? Learning to read means learning a lot of interweaving skills - like the beginning of sounds. Here's my list of my best instruction print publications and favorite free resources that I've used this year in my guided reading groups. Let me share why I use them and how you can use them in your class too. How and why I use these! to use these materials with small groups of students (4-6) who demonstrate a similar level of reading with generally similar reading strategies and skills. Sometimes I'll pull just one or two students from the group to work on a certain piece of skill before calling the rest of the group to come and join us. If they don't really get something, I try to give them extra attention this way and then adjust the time spent with the whole group accordingly. I use more games and activities as warm-ups or for actual lessons so I can watch, redirect and then give them an incredibly focused practice that we can apply to a book or lesson the next time we're going. Now let's go back to the free prints that work on: the beginning sounds of isolation, the identical sound identification, you want to follow the links for each event, so you can go download them from their original creators to use. Camping start sounds cards! use this theme of camping start sounds in two parts. I make a sheet in a dry wipe sheet by putting it in a plastic sleeve or laminating it. I use maps for students who can isolate the beginning of the sound but still can't connect what letter it is. To have only four letters to choose from, not the entire alphabet, is useful for these students. We also card - but instead of clipping the pops on the correct letter, we cover it with a bingo chip or other manipulative. Strategy Tip: Keep the alphabet chart handy for so they can refer to the sounds of the beginning to find a match if they find it difficult to isolate/connect it to the letter. This is the start of reading the Strategy Get Your Mouth Ready They use alphabet charts as a background knowledge/scheme to extract from. Beginning sounds writing way!It's a simple gameboard just to work on a handful of start letter sounds at a time. Print the beginning of the sound paths and picture the word card. Students draw a postcard, speak the word out loud and make a novice sound. They then move their marker to the corresponding letter on the game board. They don't lose it in the game aspect - they can just focus on skill, but it still feels like a game. This is a great game for students to play in pairs, so you can listen and sign up for student progress! Here's the start of the sound-way version I found available for download: CFDNGW/KLJVY/BRSPMTBingoBingo so classic. And while I'm not always a fan of it in class, I think it works well for the job at the beginning sounds like a small band. This top sound bingo is also great for strengthening vocabulary. There are many boxes in these cards, so you may need to give extra support to kinders who are struggling with both skill and vocabulary. There are several versions that I found in this game: Bingo Card 1 (a,m,n,n,p,s,t)Bingo Card 2 (o,d, f,h) Bingo Cards 3 (e,b,c, g,r) Bingo Cards 4 (i,i,h) j,k,l,w,x)Bingo Cards 5 (u,q,v,y,z) I found that with most students we only need to play a round or two before I really identified who can do this skill on their own and who needs additional practice. Starting sound sheets I pretty much hate sheets, but I like this resource for its simplicity. This start of the sound freebie leaf set has good, simplified photos and focuses only on four different start sounds at a time. Here are a few additional ways you can use a set of sheets like this: First, you can use it to make bracelets for students to wear, for each three top sounds they write correctly, they earn a new bracelet. You can also slice them into little eency-weency-tiny books. These little flipbooks are great for repetition and can be read to cool stuffed animals. Set a visual timer and allow students to write one answer on a sheet in a dry sleeve and pass it in a circle to the next person to complete the next answer. Then repeat until the sheet is made. Working as a team to beat the clock. If you use it as a sheet, students count the number every time the sound starts appearing by drawing the dot points at the top of the sheet. Which letter has the most novice sounds on the page? Let's wrap it up I hope you can use one or some of Beginner sound activities with kinders in small groups.
