

## STOCKING STUFFERS FOR 2021

Each November, Acacia Philanthropy stuffs several stockings that guild members have made. We then donate them to Thomas House to distribute to the children in their programs as well as to the graduate children of their programs. Last year 93 stockings were stuffed and donated. This year Thomas House has requested 41 filled stockings.

Items for all ages from 1-18 are requested for both boys and girls. We are ready to start collecting any stocking stuffers that you may have purchased during this time of pandemic. All stocking stuffers will be kept safely until November. Please contact Sonia at the number or email below to make arrangements for pick up.

If you have been unable to shop due to pandemic but would like to donate, Sonia will be very happy to collect cash and go shopping on your behalf. Last year we collected \$610.00 and were able to purchase a plethora of \$5 gift cards, games, puzzles, craft kits, story books, hats, toys, makeup and other items for the stockings.

## Programs and Workshops

The November meeting will also be by Zoom and the speaker will be David Owen Hastings, a designer, architect, artist, and modern quilter who will talk about “Minimal Design, Maximum Impact”. David is the past president of the Seattle Modern Quilt Guild and likes working with Japanese fabrics. This should be a little different from many of our speakers, so it is not a meeting to miss!

The workshop in November will be presented by Quilters by the Sea, our sister guild. The QBS workshop is also on a Saturday (by Zoom) but it will be on November 13<sup>th</sup>, the second Saturday, since they meet a week later than Acacia. The workshop will be by Karen Brow, teaching her pattern “Infrognito”, using the “middle to middle piecing” method. Please see our website for more information on the pattern and a picture of the block. The charge for the workshop, which includes the pattern, will be \$35.00. (Payment can be made either by credit card through our own website or directly to Stephanie Ivey 310 600-9248 at QBS) The workshop begins at 9:00 a.m.

We have reserved our usual meeting room at Ehlers Event Center for the December Acacia General Meeting. It would be nice if that includes our usual potluck celebration, but we will probably have a variation of the usual event. We can only hope that the news between now and then allows us to go back to something close to that tradition.

The January 2022 general meeting will have a lecturer by Zoom, but we may have our first “hybrid” meeting. That would be a regular in-person meeting with the lecturer coming to us by Zoom, projected onto a screen. The lecturer will be Michele Crawford with her lecture on “Just Cut the Scrap”. Michele has some really interesting ways to use up scraps. We all need more ways to use those! There will be no workshop in January due to our focus on the Tea and Quilt Auction approaching in April. (Instead of a workshop we will be working on items for the boutique at the Tea.)

You could use anything from shells to a submarine to an octopus. With this tea, as with previous teas, there will be a prize for the table with the best representation of the theme. "Wonders of the Sea" gives you a lot of choices.

We have 30 quilts either promised or already donated to the Tea for the live auction, but additional quilts are needed, so please let us know if you are working on one so it can be counted.

## JELLY ROLL CHALLENGE

The quilts made from 2½ inch strips that have been accumulating in our storage room are due at the November General Meeting. Since this will be a Zoom meeting, there will be some additional challenges to judging your work.

Most important is the fact that an evaluation of your quilt will be done based on a picture. The picture you send to Caroline by noon on November 4<sup>th</sup>, to be highlighted at the meeting, should be the best representation of that quilt that you can make. It should be a straight-on, well lit picture of the quilt hanging from a rack or draped over something to show it flat. Prizes will be awarded based on your picture of that quilt, so make it a good one.

A note should also be attached to the picture sent to Caroline indicating the size of the quilt and the first color chosen from the “first pick” packs of ten 2½ inch strips. If your quilt is extra-large, we won’t know that from a picture unless we also have the dimensions. An effort was made to make the first choice of strips as neutral as possible, but that doesn’t mean they are all the same level of “neutral”.

The first prize for the most attractive result (based on a picture) will be a total of 12 yards of color coordinated bright batik fabric. (First prize is a bundle of eight batik fat quarters plus at least one yard of each of those eight fabrics.) If you can make a quilt worthy of a prize from left over strips, just think what you could do with 12 yards of color coordinate batiks? Wow!

Second prize is a fat quarter bundle of blue/purple batiks, and third prize is a fat quarter bundle of “Shelburne Museum” print fabrics.

There are no losers in this challenge. If you participated, you got to show your creative side, Acacia has more quilts to present to Thomas House, and some of the miscellaneous bits of fabric we seem to attract was used up. Win, win, win!





Quilters by the Sea is hosting the November Workshop by Zoom on November 13th. It will be by Karen Brow-Meier of Java House Quilts, teaching her pattern "Infrognito." In this workshop, we'll create a modern frog block using the "Middle to Middle Piecing" method which makes sewing the frogs deceptively simple!

Infrognito Zoom Class – 42" x 60" Lap Quilt 9-3pm

These delightful frog blocks are template-pieced with a few great tricks to save time. (Don't let the front leg fool you.) Instruction for creating easy frog eyes with textile markers are demonstrated in class and we'll cover how to fuse or traditionally appliqué the lively frog hiding among his pieced friends. Choose a background color scheme of tone-on-tones or batiks (the mango's and butter-yellow's make the frogs pop) and fling open that stash for lively prints and batiks for your frogs. Students will complete several frogs in class and leave with the knowledge to finish this wonderful child's (or frog-lover's) quilt.

**The charge for the workshop, which includes the pattern, will be \$35.00.**

# FABRICATORS

Fabricators met on Saturday, October 16<sup>th</sup> at the Ehlers Event Center in Legacy Hall to make pads for pet carriers, requested by Jenifer Brooks and used by the members of Kindness2cats and Checkered Cats, both organizations started with the objective of rescuing cats from high kill animal shelters. Neither of these organization are registered 501(c) charities, but their goals are ones Acacia can support.

The October Fabricators meeting was less well attended than the previous month, only six members came for any length of time, but there were several other members who stopped by to check out the project or drop off pet pads (or beds) that had been made previously. A total of 23 pads to soften the ride in a pet carrier were made, or started, at the event. Jenifer did not give us dimensions for the "kitten pads" she also requested, but we improvised with some possible sizes and made three smaller, extra soft pads, that seemed right for kittens.

A stack of pet carrier pads was taken home to wash and have now been cat tested.



The next Fabricators meeting will be at the same location on November 13, 2021, from 10:00am until 3:00pm. The tentative plan is to make items for the boutique or tote bags for the homeless. Please watch the Blast for details.



