Technological advances do merge the world into one connected planet where resources can be managed rationally. Just like with power. Let's say on Sunday morning most households are running their washing machine all at the same hour, increasing the demand for electricity on the grid. If the grid can offer the device to work in the afternoon, when demand is low and even power is cheap, it will become efficient and cost-effective for the entire ecosystem. Electronics is getting smart almost set to overhaul the energy sector. Internet of Things (IoT) devices will soon be able to communicate with a smart grid when choosing the best time to use energy. This connected system will give consumers metrics on their use, even helping them manage it well. POWER' PLAY There will be a \$4.8 trillion total IoT investment between 2016 and 2021 according to a market report, but the achievements to make real sense in India, the electricity grid must become much more reliable. The grid needs to monitor almost in real time, demand for electricity and find the resources to deliver it. This can be done with a smart grid that is connected, informed, automated and authorized by smart meters with the ability to communicate and control IoT devices in the home. Thus, the Advanced Measurement Infrastructure (AMI) is a harbinger of network modernization in India, which will require a lot of investment and has become a bone of contention for energy enterprises, most of which are reeling in heavy debt and cumulative technical and commercial losses of more than 30 per cent. that deploying smart meters across Europe and the UK alone would require 63 billion euros. The Indian government has also created 14 smart grid pilot projects with a cost of 980 crore test cost-benefit analysis. As India seeks to achieve 100 per cent rural electrification by 2018, network upgrades can be very time-consuming. Reacting to this assertion, Suhas Dapare, Head-performance and efficiency, Tata Power, believes: Utility must somehow keep maintenance costs systems on a regular basis. The cost of upgrading will be absorbed by utilities over a period of time. It will also lead to more efficiency and significant savings for electricity distributors, which offsets the cost of modernization. While the cost of upgrading and AMI will eventually be borne by the consumer, this could affect the rising cost of electricity in India. Addressing concerns, R.K. Verma, chairman of the Central Electricity Authority (CEA) says: Electricity prices for consumers will not increase. This is a one-time investment in utilities, and the cost of producing smart meters is set. While currently a smart meter can cost anything between 10,000-16,000 in India, A.K. Verma, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Energy, Governor of India expects: Someone should innovate and reduce the cost below 1000 rubles per unit. NEW OPPORTUNITIES Startup ecosystem in India is a budding with great creativity. Yashraj Khaitan, founder and CEO of Gram Power, a start-up in the field of end-of-smart solutions in India, says: Big companies provide AMI solutions at rates that are not viable. An electric smart meter at this price is useless in rural areas. Gram Power has developed an intelligent meter at an affordable price, in addition to many other components and smart grid controllers. Highlighting business opportunities for companies in the smart grid sector, Hitesh Chaniara, Director (Power and Utilities), PwC reports: The government has instructed utilities to install smart meters for consumers consuming more than 200 units per month by December 2019 and for all consumers by 2027. Over the next decade, India is projected to invest \$44.9 billion in smart metering, distribution automation, battery storage and other segments of the smart grid market. While large companies may be the fiercest competitors, another start-up in the smart networking sector, which was incubated in IIM Ahmedabad, considers it more of a partner than a struggle. Harith Soni, co-founder of Ecolibrum Energy, says: Big companies such as Cisco and Schneider have an international experience that is very different from the reality on the ground in India. With an understanding of the Indian scenario, we with large companies like Honeywell to provide large companies with energy data analysis services that can help their customers reduce energy costs and manage their energy better. He adds: Competition of start-ups in this space is limited. This is because compared to the launch of an e-commerce website, a startup in the power business has to have a domain domain and the technical capabilities that are barriers to entry for them. TOWARDS CONVERGENCE Large scale disruption occurs in the energy sector by integrating renewable energy, roof, decentralized generation and improved technologies into battery storage. We will have no choice but to switch to smart networks, said P.K. Pujari,

secretary of the Energy Ministry. From technology to infrastructure, the entire ecosystem is moving towards integration. However, utilities can face many challenges when switching to a smart grid. Expressing concern for energy distribution companies, Ajoy Rajani, Senior Executive Vice President of Reliance Infrastructure, says: From a utility perspective, we need an expanded ecosystem of smart meter providers. Data plus Analytics is actually useful information. There is a whole ecosystem of organizations that have to do data analysis beyond just billing. I think we barely scratched the surface. In addition, utilities and the market can benefit from more system integrators that will work with multiple meter suppliers. (This article was first published in the April issue of Entrepreneur magazine. Using a grid is a popular way to make sure your proportions and layout in the drawing are correct. This is especially useful when accuracy is important. There are a few things to think about when preparing a grid drawing, so you can get better results without doing extra work for yourself. When selecting an image to copy, make sure it's large and clear. You might want to do a photocopy or print a computer, rather than draw directly on a photo. You need an image with clear lines and edges - a blurry image makes it hard to find a line to follow. Determine the size of the grid. If the grid is too big, you will have to do too much drawing between each square. If the grid is too small, it will be difficult for you to erase, and it can become very confusing. There is no definite rule, since the size of your picture and subject matter can be so varied - but something from one inch to half an inch will be about right. You don't have to share your photo mathematically - if the last squares are only half full, that's fine. a mesh image ready to draw. Obviously you don't want to work on the original photo. You can photocopy or scan and print your photo. When you use your computer, you can use a photo or paint program to add a grid before printing. Most programs will have a grid and ruler option that you can use as a guide. If You only have the original photo and there is no access to the scanner, you can also use a sheet of plastic - clear sheets of photocopies are the best, or a clear sleeve from the display book; Even sheet glass or perspex from an old picture frame - and draw your lines on that instead of your photo. Copying the grid Your drawing paper using a sharp, B pencil (medium hardness) and a light touch, so you can erase it easily. While this process can be used to scale the drawing up or down, it's much easier to get good results if you use the same grid size. mesh drawing in the process. When copying an image, use spare sheets of paper to cover some images so you can focus on multiple squares at a time. This is especially useful for large photos that can be misleading. Place the picture and the original image close together so you can look straight from one to the other. The grid lines act as landmarks to help you draw a line in the right place. Look for clear edges in the picture. In this example, you can clearly see the outline of the jug in the background. Notice where the shape crosses the grid line - this is the starting point you can use. Don't try to measure where it is on the grid, but rather judge its position (halfway up? one-third?) and find the same spot on the drawing grid. Follow the form, looking for where the line next meets the grid. The shaded gray area shows NEGATIVE SPACE formed between the object and the grid. Observing these forms can help you keep an eye on the shape of the line. Notice how the grey space looks pretty triangular, with a couple of pieces taken out - making it easy to copy. The completed grid pattern will include all the main lines of the object - contour, important details and clear shadow shapes. If you want to specify the position of fine parts, such as illumination, use a light dotted line. Now you can thoroughly erase the mesh, patch any erased parts of your drawing as you go - if you drew it easily enough, it shouldn't be hard. The grid in this example is much darker than I would actually draw in practice. You can then complete it as a drawing line, or add shading. If you need a very clean surface, you can trace your completed sketch on a fresh piece of paper. This method is useful for transferring the drawing to large sheets for pastel drawings or canvas for painting. When you zoom in on the drawing, you should be especially careful of distortion; Lack of detail in the original can be a problem.
