

But the hour cometh, and now is - John 4:23



For more than 50,000 people who died in the Covid-19 pandemic, their hour came. For another million who were infected, each one is facing the hour wondering if it would be their last.

The verse is taken from Christ's conversation with the Samaritan woman that *the time is coming when true worshippers will worship God in spirit and truth.*

This week as you go about your days, with the circuit breaker stay-home directive, take time to reflect on your life, faith and legacy. See if you can do better and strive to make your life a blessing.

For me this week, I will celebrate my 73rd birthday, and the reflection would be especially significant. Still, I know that I have miles to go (and promises to keep) before the hour.

When New Zealand was hit by Covid-19, their prime minister was caught by surprise but acted quickly, asking every citizen to act as if they had contracted the pandemic. In our hour of circuit breaker restrictions, we would do well to put on this mindset and perhaps contain the virus with similar success.

From John 4:23, we get the phrase 'cometh the hour, cometh the man', signifying that whatever the challenge may be, there can be a person to meet and overcome it. This phrase has often been attributed to British prime minister, Sir Winston Churchill during WWII whose V for victory sign is now universally known.

Every day is precious, indeed every hour. Tonight I will share a lesson on the length of time that God has given each one of us. Our time is in His hands and we would do well to bide each hour in Him.




The church draws its strength from their families. The stronger the family is in faith and togetherness, the stronger the church will be.





Singapore will soon begin to see good results like Hong Kong and South Korea.


I will share 2 theme sermons in May - 'Walking with Jesus' and 'A Man after God's Own Heart'.



MCCY has announced not only the extension of the Circuit Breaker by another month, but also more stringent measures. The Household of Faith will continue live streaming during the extended period, but are only permitted a technician without a worship team. Our minister therefore will conduct the entire service with pre-recorded acapella hymns. Keep up with your worship at 6pm each Sunday. We are arranging delivery of communion kits for May. ELEVATED SAFE DISTANCING MEASURES FOR RELIGIOUS ORGANISATIONS

On 3 Apr 2020, MOH announced elevated safe distancing measures minimise local transmission of COVID-19. These measures will be in effect from 7 A 2020 until 4 May 2020. This advisory provides guidance to religious leaders on t mentation of these measures for religious organisations

Further Restrictions on Faith-based Activities

- From 26 Mar 2020, religious organisations were to suspend all congregation worship and religious services, while places of worship could remain open for priva worship and some rites¹ for not more than 10 persons at any one time.
- From 7 Apr 2020 to 4 May 2020 (inclusive), religious organisations are
 - a. All religious services will remain suspended and all places of worsh will be closed to the public.
 - b. Columbariums in places of worship will be closed to visitors. Famili may continue to install niches for their loved ones in private ceremoni involving not more than 10 persons and with the precautionary measur listed in the Annex.
 - c. Where necessary, places of worship may continue to condu funeral rites. Funerals and wakes should involve no more than persons at any one time (excluding religious and other supporti workers, which must be kept to a minimum) and comply with tprecautionary measures listed in the Annex.
 - d. All other religious activities² that were previously subject to no more th 10 persons, will now be fully suspended.
 - e. Activities at workplace premises should also be suspended. Religio organisations must have their employees/religious workers work fro home (i.e. telecommute), if they wish to continue their operations.
- Some religious organisations may wish to explore alternative means to supp the religious needs of their communities such as live streaming, podcasts and onli ancestral praying. If so, the activities and the people involved in implementing the

During this period, religious leaders are to strongly advise their followers not to hold religious gatherings3 in private settings, except with family members in the same household. This is to minimise movement and interactions of people in public and private places, and for people to stay home as much as possible.

Full Implementation of Measures

Religious organisations are to fully implement these safe distancing measures as soon as possible and no later than 7 Apr 2020. Persons and organisations that do not comply will face stiff penalties under the Infectious Diseases Act.⁴

Social Responsibility is Critical

We understand that these additional measures can be disruptive to religious life but they are necessary to slow the spread of COVID-19, and protect Singapore We encourage religious leaders to advise their communities to Stay Home (to) Stay Safe, during this critical period. Through our collective efforts, we can keep Singapore safe from COVID-19.

From Our Minister's Desk:

Our Live Streaming Worship



There are now 7 live streaming videos of our sermons and worships, linked from the Household of Faith Supporters and Friends group on Facebook. Our first video was "Hope for the Hopeless", uploaded by brother Barnabas on 29th March 2020. It was a test run recorded at our regular services at the Metropolitan YMCA.

As things turned out, the very next week, religious assemblies were restricted from 100 to 10 persons. We then met at the home of the Alfred Poons and broadcasted our first official live streaming worship.

In the next few weeks, the restrictions became more stringent, and we were prevented from visiting anyone, even our extended families. We moved our 'studio' to my office with a skeleton crew to continue the live streaming worships.

These restrictions have now been further tightened and only two persons are allowed to be involved in the live streaming. Pre-recorded songs have are used instead of a worship team.

Our minister worked with brother Paul Poon and his family to video the worship songs, and with brother Barnabas Thng to video the prayers and sermon. These videos are edited and put together by brother Barnabas each week for members and friends. At our last assembly in March, we were averaging an attendance of 30-40. Since our first live streaming, the number of views at 6pm on Sundays climbed to over 60. If we assume 2 persons per view, over 100 persons participated in the worship. Over a hundred more click on our links each week to view the sermon.

God has enabled more people to participate with us during the pandemic. We hope that when restrictions are eased, and we are able to assemble again, some of these people who participated with us online, may join us in person for our regular services.



Every week, friends and members text and emailed me asking how we are dealing with the Coronavirus pandemic. Here is an update.

Singapore has been tightening restrictions since March with schools, most commercial businesses and services closed, and visits between immediate family members from different households disallowed.

Since the daily infections are now falling, there has been some easing of restrictions since May 5th and more restrictions will be lifted on June 12th.

However, religious gatherings will be the last to be lifted. The Household of Faith is a small congregation and we can assemble again if up to 50 people are allowed to meet.

To date the number fatalities is 20 deaths, all victims over 55 years old. No migrant workers have succumbed to the virus.

Singapore continues to have an ample supply of food as well as adequate health care.

The government is leaving no stone unturned in taking care of our migrant workers, including

ensuring that they are receiving their salary during this pandemic. Better quarters are now available, including free food and wifi. The latest facilities are the Singapore Polytechnic lecturers' quarters at Dover Road.

The Household of Faith will continue to live stream our worships every Sunday at 6pm, with all videos available for viewing at any time on our Facebook Household of Faith Supporters and Friends Group.

We will continue to mail out the weekly Fidelity and ensure that communion kits are available for members. If you would prefer to receive an email copy, let us know.

Friendship with Jonathan

1 Samuel 18:1-4 It happened, when he had made an end of speaking to Saul, that the soul of Jonathan was knit with the soul of David, and Jonathan loved him as his own soul. Saul took him that day, and would let him go no more home to his father's house. Then Jonathan and David made a covenant, because he loved him as his own soul. 



What Do You Make of the Pandemic?

This was the question my cardiologist asked me when I was in his clinic last Friday for my quarterly checkup. He knows that I am a preacher.

Without hesitation, I replied that God regularly reminds us how helpless we are and how much we need to put our trust in Him. The pandemic is just a way of tapping us on our shoulder and reminding us to look up and reflect on our relationship with him.

Developed countries like the UK boast of empty churches because they have become self-reliant and no longer depend on God.

This is what we learn from David, when he decided to do a census of his fighting men. Joab, his second in command advised him not to do it, because Joab realised that all Israel's success was a result of God's blessings.

Nevertheless, Joab submitted to King David's command, and in 1 Chronicles 21:5, Joab told David the sum of his fighting troops. *All those of Israel were one million one hundred thousand men who drew sword: and in Judah were four hundred seventy thousand men who drew sword.*

The following verses tell us that God was greatly displeased with David and 70,000 men perished

because David was over confident and put his trust in his great army.

Today, like David, many rest secure, not in our trust in God, but in the balance of our bank accounts.

As we return to normal, survive the pandemic and resume life as usual, we may be missing the whole point. David was a man after God's heart, because he repented and learned from his mistakes.

We can be like David, if we renew our faith and put our trust in God. We can repent from the way we are living, and move some of our assets to benefit our family, friends and the church.


May we be reminded of Proverbs 3:5, 6 as Phase I of the restrictions are lifted:





GRADUAL RESUMPTION OF RELIGIOUS ACTIVITIES

On 19 May 2020, the Multi-Ministry Taskforce announced a phased approach to resuming activities safely from 2 Jun 2020. This advisory provides guidance to religious organisations (ROs) on the phased approach for the resumption of religious activities.

- ROs should continue to support the religious needs of their communities via remote means such as recording and broadcast of religious services and prayers.
 - a. There should be no more than 5 persons on-site at a time for the digital production of these services. Time spent on-site for this purpose must be kept as short as possible. ROs may return on-site for these activities as and when required but we encourage ROs to plan their production schedule as everyone must continue to limit their movements outside



How God Looks at Man

In our previous series on King David, we learn from 1 Samuel 16:7 that God said to Samuel, "Don't look on his face, or on the height of his stature; because I have rejected him: for Yahweh sees not as

man sees; for man looks at the outward appearance, but Yahweh looks at the heart."



We look at a person and see his stature, beauty and the clothes he wears. Often people are invisible to us because of the way they look and the menial work they do. Younger people have no time for old people and often regard them as being in their way or slowing down their progress to their destination.

I could go on and on, but I confess that I have been doing the many of these things that I have just mentioned. I have to constantly remind myself that it is wrong, that it is not the way God looks at us and that I should extend to everyone my right hand of fellowship.

Let us be reasonable. How can a God who create all things be impressed with a mere human being? Your looks, intelligence or

accomplishments are as insignificant as an ant's hill to a human.

No wonder King David ask in Psalms 8:3-5 When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, The moon and the stars, which you have ordained; What is man, that you think of him? The son of man, that you care for him?

It is important not to forget what the Bible says in James 2:1-9:


My brothers, don't hold the faith of our Lord Jesus Christ of glory with partiality.

For if a man with a gold ring, in fine clothing, comes into your assembly, and a poor man in filthy clothing also comes in; and you pay special attention to him who wears the fine clothing... haven't you shown partiality among yourselves, and become judges with evil thoughts?... However, if you fulfill the royal law, according to the Scripture, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself," you do well. But if you show partiality, you commit sin, being convicted by the law as transgressors. \square



The Christian and His Assets

We are so blessed in Singapore with so many good things bestowed upon us by our heavenly Father. Lest we take them for granted, let us go to the Bible and see what it says concerning our management of them.



3 Things

The first thing to bear in mind is that all we are, and all we have, comes from God. Revelation 4:11 - "You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they were created and have their being."

Next, we need to define assets in terms of time, service and possessions.

Lastly, we have to understand that we alone are responsible for how we use these assets. Romans 2:6 *God* "will repay each person according to what they have done."

1, Time

What God wants most from all of us is our time with Him, talking to Him in prayer and learning from Him in Bible reading, like Mary did. Luke 10:42 but few things are needed—or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her.

It would be interesting for each one of us to calculate how much time we return to God compared to all our activities of the day.

2. Service

This is something all of us can do if we have a heart to please God.

There are some who devote their lives to the ministry, but you can also serve God by reaching out to your family and friends. Jesus said in Matthew 25:40, '*Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.*'

3. Possessions

God has never asked us to give beyond that we are able or willing.

The work of the Household of Faith continues because of the sacrificial, heartfelt and freewill gifts of members. 2 Corinthians 9:7 *Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.*

Conclusion

The Bible not only has much to say about how we should use our assets, but also highlights many examples that we can emulate.

David delighted in spending his time in the house of the Lord - Psalms 27:4 *One thing I ask from the LORD, this only do I seek: that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to gaze on the beauty of the LORD and to seek him in his temple.*

Dorcas was a wonderful example of service to others - Acts 9:36 *In Joppa there was a disciple named Tabitha* (in Greek her name is Dorcas); she was always doing good and helping the poor.

The Macedonian Christians gave sacrificially of their possessions - 2 Corinthians 8:3 For I testify that they gave as much as they were able, and even beyond their ability.

God loves you and has bestowed upon you assets, like He did when He gave out talents to His servants in Matthew 25:15. It is up to us to decide how to use them and will be accountable to God after our life.







Five Considerations

When Looking for a Home Church

Since we are now in Phase II of our recovery, we are looking forward in the near future to return to regular worship. So many have come to worship with us online through live streaming and we look forward to some joining us when we resume our assembly.



1. Basis of Faith

The first thing in looking for a home church is to see the basis of faith. Is it based on some creed book, tradition, charismatic experiences, or the Bible? The Bible alone should be the foundation of faith.

2 Timothy 3:16-17 "All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness; so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work."

2. Salvation by Grace

Some churches who may look to the Bible as the foundation of faith, may interpret the Bible in a legalistic way. It is so important to filter every doctrine through the grace of God.

Ephesians 2:8-9 "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, that no one would boast."

3. Activities of the Church

If you have a family consisting of youth and

young adults, you may want to look for a larger and older congregation with established activities for every member of the family.

4. Goals of the Church

It is easy to size up the main thrust of a church after a few visits. For example, the Household of Faith was birthed out of evangelism, and members are constantly encouraged to reach out to their family and friends.

5. Your Contribution

Finally, you may want to consider what you can and want to contribute to a home church. Usually, in a small congregation, more is required of every member compared to a larger church where the work is more equally distributed.

Conclusion

Choosing a home church is both exciting and challenging. Everyone should choose thoughtfully and carefully.

Once this is done, we should give of our best to participate, contribute and do our part to build up the church.

RESUMPTION OF MORE RELIGIOUS ACTIVITIES IN PHASE TWO

Worship Services

- 11. Places of worship may resume congregational and other worship services, starting with up to 50 persons at a time (excluding religious and supporting workers, which should be kept to a minimum), subject to safe management measures.³
- 12. Places of worship should observe the following safe management measures for worship services:
 - a. Worshippers have to observe 1 metre safe distance between others if they
 are worshipping individually. Worshippers may also worship in groups of no
 more than 5 persons, with 1 metre safe distancing between groups.
 - b. Keep worship services to as short a duration as possible. Worshippers should leave immediately after performing their worship. There should be no reception or mingling between worshippers, before, during or after each worship service.
 - c. All persons present must wear a face mask at all times.⁴ Those who are involved in the conduct of the worship service (e.g. preachers, prayer leader, scripture reader) may wear a face shield when performing their speaking duties and must be at least 1 metre away from any other individual.
