STATION 1: GUANGZHOU (CANTON)

The Cradle of Lingnan Culture & The Flower City's Grand Welcome

Day 0: Feb 14th (Lunar Dec 28th)

Arrival: The First Taste of Canton

- **Arrival at CAN:** You will land at Guangzhou Baiyun International Airport (CAN), the global aviation hub of Southern China.

Day 1: Feb 15th (Lunar Dec 29th)

(迎春花市, 岭南文化体验)

Breakfast: The Philosophy of the Rice Roll



We start with the ultimate street breakfast: Cantonese Rice Rolls (Cheung Fun).

Watch as the chef pours the milky liquid onto a steaming cloth; within seconds, it solidifies into a sheet as thin as a cicada's wing. Wrapped around fresh meat and drizzled with soy sauce, it is more than food—it is a metaphor for Guangzhou: Resilient yet silky, light yet efficient. Unlike a heavy European breakfast, this provides a clean, agile energy to start the day.

Morning: The "Human Sea" at Xihu Flower Market

Prepare for a sensory baptism. We dive into the legendary Xihu Road Flower Market.

- **Cultural Context:** In the West, buying flowers is often a romantic, personal gesture of leisure. In Guangzhou, it is a **collective oath to a better life**.
- **The Ritual:** This is the custom of "Walking the Flower Street." Dinner: The Reunion Dinner (Nian Ye Fan)



Tonight, we join the most important event in the Chinese world: The Reunion Dinner.

- **The Concept:** If Western New Year is about partying, Chinese New Year is about **"Returning to Your Position."**

Prepare for adrenaline. The Lion Dance here is not a simple street parade; it is an acrobatic feat performed on high poles (Meihuazhuang) meters above the ground.



- **The Philosophy:** This art requires the balance of a gymnast and the explosive power of a fighter. Watch as the "Lion" leaps, flips, and performs **"Cai Qing"** (Plucking the Greens)—a symbolic act of snatching good luck from the heavens.

Day 4: Feb 18th (Lunar New Year Day 2)

Shunde: The "UNESCO City of Gastronomy" & The Pursuit of Perfection

Cultural Note: On the Second Day of the New Year, married daughters traditionally return to their parents' homes with their husbands. It is a day of grand feasts and homecoming.

We drive to **Shunde**, the culinary capital of Cantonese cuisine. If Guangzhou is the dining room, Shunde is the kitchen.

Morning: The Aesthetics of Silence

- **Garden Yum Cha:** We start with a delicate Morning Tea in a Lingnan-style garden. Shunde Dim Sum is famous for its "Handmade Precision."

- **Qinghui Garden:** A stark contrast to the festival noise. We stroll through this masterpiece of landscape architecture. Notice the intricate water pavilions and "leak windows" (lattice windows). It reflects the scholar's pursuit of **Nature, Light, and Layout**—a moment of visual silence.

- **Wu Mi Zhou (Rice-less Porridge):** A hotpot base made from rice water, yet containing no rice grains. It is thick, smooth, and naturally sweet.
- **The Logic:** This starchy water seals the moisture of fresh seafood and meat instantly when poached. It is a culinary hack discovered centuries ago to maximize "Umami."

Evening:

STATION 3: JIANGMEN & CHAOSHAN

Day 5: Feb 19th (Lunar New Year Day 3)

Chikan Ancient Town: The Golden Age of Migration & The Festival of Fire

We travel back to the 1920s. We arrive at **Chikan Ancient Town**, a UNESCO-recognized heritage site built by overseas Chinese returning from the West.

Visuals: The Arcade Architecture (Qilou)

Walking down these streets feels like walking onto a movie set. You see 600+ "Qilou" (Arcade Buildings) lining the riverbanks.

- **The Story:** These structures are a fusion of East and West—Roman columns mixed with Chinese roofs. They are stone-carved proof of the wealth and hardship of the first Chinese immigrants who ventured into the "South Seas" (Southeast Asia/America).



- **The Vibe:** Today, these historic streets are alive with festive lanterns, giant floral plaques, and koi fish lights, blending nostalgia with New Year joy.

The Main Event: The Carnival of Intangible Heritage

At night, Chikan transforms into a theater of raw, primitive power:

- **The Fire Dragon Dance:** Watch a dragon constructed of burning incense weave through the crowd, blessing the town.
- **The Iron Flower Show (Da Tie Hua):** This is the visual climax. It is not gunpowder; it is **Molten Iron Art**.
 - **The Spectacle:** Brave performers throw 1600°C molten iron against a cold wall, creating an explosion of millions of golden sparks. It is dangerous, breathtaking, and deeply reverent—a ritual of fire and steel that predates modern fireworks.

Night:

We stay inside a Heritage Hotel within the ancient town, falling asleep to the echoes of a bygone era.

Day 6: Feb 20th (Lunar New Year Day 4)

- **The Precision:** You will learn to distinguish cuts like "Neck Yoke" (Xue Bo) and "Dragon's Back"

(Diao Long). Each cut has a specific boiling time—counted in seconds. This rigor reflects the **Chaoshan Business Philosophy**: Calculate everything, waste nothing, and pursue absolute quality.

Night:

Light Show over the Han River.

Morning: The Yingge (Hero's Song) Dance

We head to the source to see the Yingge Dance.



- **The Visual:** Dancers paint their faces like the bandit heroes of *Water Margin*.
- **The Energy:** This is a "**Chinese Warrior Dance**." To the thunderous beat of drums, hundreds of dancers strike wooden sticks together in perfect unison. It is raw, masculine, and explosive.

- **The Meaning:** It symbolizes resilience and unity. It shows the "Grit" of the Chaoshan people—a tribe that has survived centuries of migration and hardship through sheer fighting spirit.

Afternoon: The Open Port (Shantou Old Town)

We explore the Shantou Small Park district. This was a treaty port in 1860. The dense European-style baroque buildings tell the story of trade and return.

Evening: The Ocean Rituals



Depending on the local schedule, we will either witness the Fish Lantern Parade on Nanao Island (a romantic prayer for safe voyages) or join the Grand Garden Party in the city center.

It is the perfect ending to understand the dual nature of Chaoshan people: Fierce Warriors (Yingge) yet Gentle Traders (Lanterns).

STATION 4: THE MOUNTAIN & THE FINALE

The Philosophy of Aroma & The Perfect Circle

Day 8: Feb 22nd (Lunar New Year Day 6)

Phoenix Mountain: The Scent of Tea & The Fortress of Lineage

We escape the coastal humidity and ascend into the clouds. We take our private van up to **Phoenix Mountain (Fenghuang Shan)**.

Morning: Immersion in the Tea Gardens — A Philosophy of Aroma

We visit a family that has cultivated **Phoenix Dancong (Single Trunk) Tea** for generations.

- **The Process:** Step into the roasting room. Wrapped in the warm, toasty scent of tea leaves, you will witness the intricate roasting process.
- **Cultural Contrast:** Coffee is about impact and boldness. Phoenix Tea is about "Hui Gan" (Sweet
