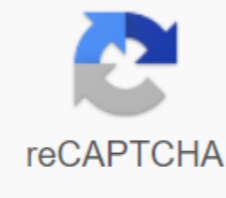

We rely on reference groups to understand the social norms that then shape our values, ideas, behavior and appearance. This means that we also use them to estimate the relative cost, desirability or feasibility of these things. The concept of the reference group is one of the most basic sociology. Sociologists believe that our attitude towards groups and society as a whole shapes our individual thoughts and behaviors. The way we treat reference groups is central to the way social groups and societies exert social power on us as individuals. Looking at reference groups - whether racial, class, gender, sexual, religious, religious, ethnic, age or localized groups, defined in particular in the neighborhood or school - we see norms and dominant values, and we choose to either accept and reproduce them in our own thoughts, behaviors and interactions with others; or we reject and refute them by thinking and acting in ways that break away from them. Embracing the rules of the reference group and expressing them ourselves, how we achieve important connections with others that lead to social recognition - this is how we fit in and achieve a sense of belonging. Conversely, those of us who either cannot or do not want to accept and express the norms of reference groups that are expected of us can be seen as outings, criminals, or in other cases revolutionaries or legislators of fashion. The expression of the rules and behaviour of the reference group through consumption is one of the most easily visible examples of this phenomenon. When choosing which clothes to buy and wear, for example, we usually mean people around us, such as friends or peers, colleagues, or stylistic reference groups such as preppie, hipster or ratchet. We know what is normal and expected, paying attention to our reference group, and then we reproduce these norms in our own choices and consumer appearance. Thus, the team influences our values (what is cool, beautiful or appropriate) and our behavior (what we buy and how we dress). Gender norms are another naive example of how reference groups shape our thoughts and behavior. From a young age, boys and girls receive both explicit and implicit messages from others and from the media, which dictate the norms of behavior and appearance. As we grow, help groups form our grooming habits on the basis of gender (shaving and other hair removal practices, hairstyle, etc.), how we interact with others based on their field, how we physically carry and comport our bodies, and what our bodies are, and what we live in our personal relationships with others (how to be a good spouse, or son or daughter, for example).
