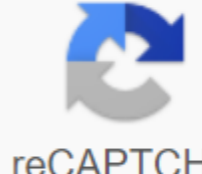


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In honor of Earth Day, this week (April 20 - 24, 2020) The Girl Scouts Colorado advocacy program team helps The Cadets earn their tree icon at home. For step one, we designed treehouse. In the second stage we dug into the amazing science of trees. We did a creative project starring trees for Step Three. We explored the link between humans and trees for Step 4. For the last part, step five, we're going to learn how to help the trees thrive. You can take action by planting a tree or helping, usually an existing tree in a yard or park (make sure to ask permission and practice social distancing). Several organizations allow you to apply for a free tree for planting. However, since most of them have received a large volume of applications this year, free trees are hard to find. Contact the National Wildlife Federation in August 2020, when applications can be re-opened. You can also do a web search for local tree programs in your area. If you get your hands on a tree to plant, make sure you research how best to plant and take care of it. Arborday.org has many free guides and resources. If you can't find a tree to plant, watch our video to learn how to care for an existing tree. Choose one, or if you feel really inspired, do both. Make a sheet of art. Watch this video to see how to make a wax sheet of paper pressing. Or, use this link to learn how to create simple painted leaf prints: or Make a Tree Ring Autobiography. The way you can tell certain things about the life of a tree year after year through its rings. It's called dendrochronology. Inspiring the cross-section of the tree and its rings, chronicle your life in the rings of the tree. Starting from the middle of the circle to the smallest ring, write down the first about yourself or the first thing you can remember (your year of birth, where you were born, parents' names, etc.). As you move out into larger circles, fill out each ring with moments, people, memories, places, and personalities for those times. For example, your second ring may be kindergarten through second grade and may include your friends from that time, favorite things where you lived, etc. in the future. Time is needed: 45-60 minutes Materials are needed: a sheet of plain white paper Pencil rulers or straight edge colored pencils or markers (optional) Internet access from a computer or mobile phone setting: Know trees to love them. Even if you have a few trees in your area, you will still be able to participate in this Activity: Check out the basics of architectural drawings, and develop a plan for the home tree of your dreams. It can be simple or complicated, it's up to you. Then submit your plans to friends or family members to see if they also like to live there. Over there. Steps below: Go online and search the Treehouse building video. Find one that talks about how different types of trees can affect the design of a treehouse. Think of the three best tree tree species, and choose the tree you want to design the treehouse out of. Or take five minutes to go outside and find a tree in your backyard or neighborhood with an adult. Tie it up if possible, or commit it as a keepsake so you can draw it when you get home. If you have a tree in mind, make a simple drawing of it on a simple piece of paper. Remember: Drawing can be simple or complex, just like the instructor in the video shared. Now let your creative energy go as you return online and find another video that talks about how a professional architect will draw or design a treehouse. Explore the video to learn the basics of architectural drawing. Think about how you will draw a tree house as you watch the video. Finally it's time to draw your house on a tree! As you draw, ask yourself some design questions. For example: How do you get in a tree house? (Stairway, swinging bridge, or zip line?) What will be the features of your home? (Windows, hammocks, deck, or hatch?) How would someone use the

treehouse you designed? (Is it for young children, adults or the whole family?) Do you want to design a home for the night or just a place hangout?
