Source: Thinkstock If you don't like waiting for things, Amazon (NASDAQ: AMN) feels your pain and wants to help. Starting Thursday, the online store will take several steps to put orders in the hands of customers as quickly as possible. Amazon is adding Dallas and San Francisco to the list of cities where same-day shipping is available, as well as shifting back-time cuts for customers to place same-day delivery orders in some cities. For example, customers in Phoenix previously had to place orders before 9:30 a.m. to receive items on the same day. Customers in Phoenix, San Francisco and other cities can now place orders as early as 12:15 p.m., and Amazon promises that deliveries will arrive by 9 p.m. that night. Amazon also lowers the same-day delivery price. In some cities, customers can pay \$5.99 for up to 150 pounds of goods to arrive on the same day. Previously, each individual item in the shipment would cost \$3.99 for the same service. Not all items are available for same-day delivery, so Amazon also makes it easier to find those that by adding new search filters and a section called Local Express Delivery. They also reduce same-day delivery prices for Amazon Prime members. All of these moves are in line with Amazon's recent push to speed up its services as much as possible - and thus make it less likely that customers will drop into a local store to pick up items that they need. Just last week, The Wall Street Journal reported that Amazon is testing its own delivery service, which could eventually compete with UPS, FedEx and the U.S. Postal Service. This service, which is being tested in San Francisco, Los Angeles and New York, will give Amazon more control over customer experience from start to finish, and could save the company a lot of money in shipping costs. Former Amazon executives have said that widespread adoption of any such delivery service is unlikely to happen for years. The company discussed even more bizarre plans that could also happen eventually. One idea that made headlines recently was Amazon's plan to deliver packages using drones that could significantly reduce waiting times for customers. They also patented what's called a pre-expected delivery package, which, based on your purchase history, will start sending items to your home even before you have placed an order. While these plans may sound like science fiction, if any company tries to make them a reality, it's probably Amazon. However, we are far from such a fast delivery becoming a reality for everyone. Same-day delivery is only available in a few cities, and it's still hard to imagine the days when unmanned helicopters will ring the doorbell to hand you a packet of your socks Even in cities that have same-day delivery, it can almost all day for the parcel to arrive. It can always be faster to run to your local store to buy something, even if it's not more convenient. However, for people who want their online orders as quickly as possible, no company does more to realize their dreams than Amazon. More from the Wall St. Cheat sheet: (Pocket-Lint) - Let's be clear from the get-go: Amazon Day is not Amazon Prime Day, the online retailer's annual sales extravaganza. No, instead, it's a new feature exclusively for Prime members, although it's currently only available through invite only. With Amazon Day, Prime members will essentially get a new delivery option, according to CNET. The Invitation-only feature allows participants to select a specific day of the week for their Amazon deliveries. So, if you choose Friday, all the items you bought during the week will arrive on Amazon Day, or Friday. This day will be your default if you don't change it at checkout. Amazon said Amazon day orders will arrive in as few boxes as possible in order to help the environment. Apparently, customers also wanted a better idea of when their deliveries would arrive so they could avoid the porch theft and be home for delivery. Prime members who join the program should also see the new version of Amazon Day when they check out and choose their delivery option. When they check out, they will be able to choose from a regular one day, two days, or no rush delivery (most items for two-day deliveries will get a new version of Amazon Day). Thus, Prime members can still use other shipping options, such as a free two-day one for each order. If weekend deliveries are available in their area, they can also set Saturday to be their default delivery day. Currently, the program is only available to a small group of users by invitation, although Amazon reportedly plans to expand the test to more users in the coming months. If you've been invited, you'll see a notification on Amazon's homepage and see the option at checkout. Amazon told the media that it was excited to test a new service aimed at making the delivery experience more convenient for customers. It is currently limited to Prime members in the United States. UPS also wrote in a statement that most of their services continue with the same expected delivery times that our customers expect. Even so, it's probably a good idea to send flowers on the early side, since UPS and FedEx have suspended their refund guarantees due to the uncertainty of COVID-19. After placing the order in advance, there is no reason to worry about the potential health consequences of delivering flowers to your mom. First, the World Health Organization wrote that the likelihood of contracting COVID-19 from a package that traveled and was exposed to various conditions is low. In addition, UPS, FedEx and USPS have taken steps to ensure that drivers use masks, gloves and disinfectants. Another precaution taken by UPS and FedEx is to temporarily suspend the package registration requirement, so delivery can take place without contact. So you can check confident knowing that you can safely send the flowers to your mom. With so many beautiful arrangements available this year, and measures in place to deliver them safely, there's no reason you can't brighten up Mom's Day with a bouquet.
