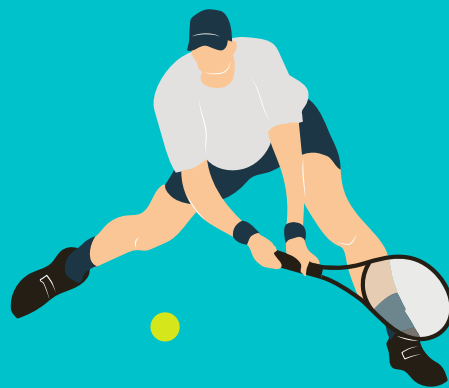

time-out: to stop an activity or sports game for a short period of time. (noun)

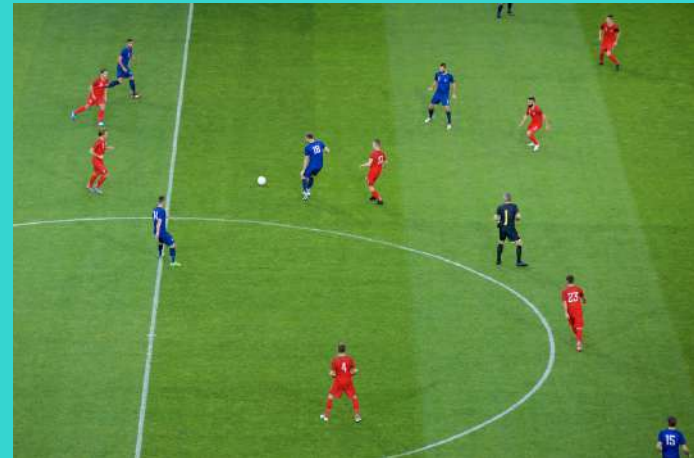
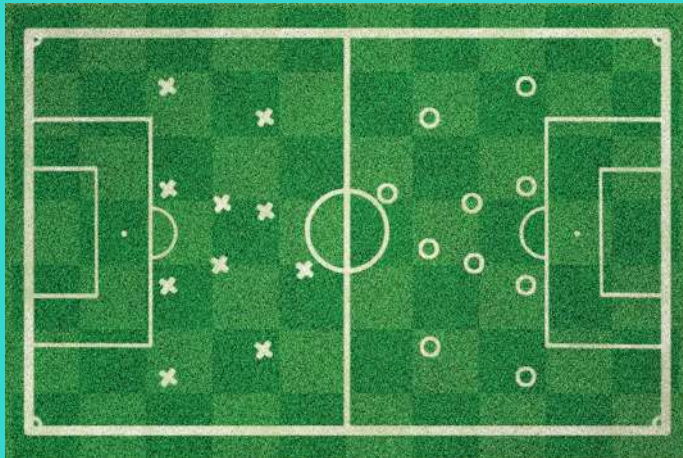


The coach called **time-out** so he could talk to the players for a moment.

position: the area or part someone plays in a game when relating to sports. (noun)



The soccer player knows it is important to stay in his **position** on the field.

compete: take part in a game or activity with other people and try to win. (verb)

Teamwork



Ella and Evan are both 12 years old. They have been great friends ever since they met at tennis camp 5 years ago. They both enjoy playing competitive tennis and have won many matches. Today they are going to compete in a tournament as a doubles team. This means they will play together as partners against other teams. Neither Ella nor Evan have played doubles before. Their tennis coach will be there with them today to help them learn the game.



Teamwork



The first match did not start out well. Both players were so used to playing alone, that they didn't know how to work well as a team. They knew the importance of proper footwork, how to hit the ball well with their forehand and backhand, both players could serve the ball well, but they just couldn't figure out how to do these things well together. It was very frustrating for both of them. Their coach had seen enough. He called a time-out so he could talk to Evan and Ella.

Teamwork



Coach explained to Ella and Evan that playing on a team requires teamwork. You are both running after the ball and not staying in your position on the court. You have to communicate with each other, take responsibility for your job on the team, trust your teammate, and keep a good attitude. Ella and Evan understood. 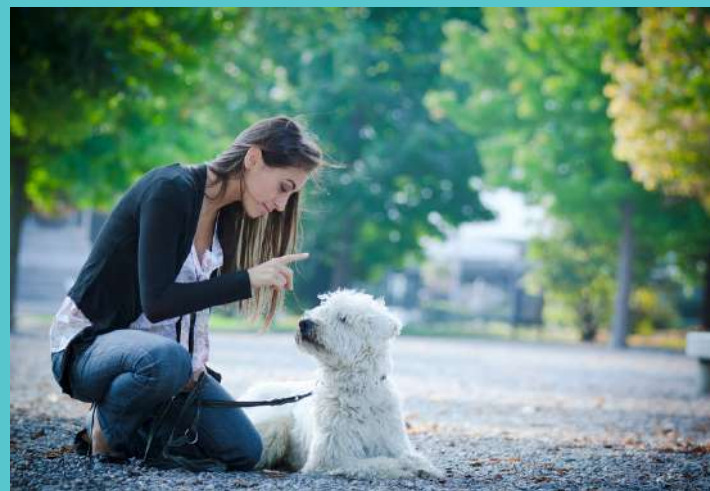
