Her work is very hard, but she keeps a good **attitude** about it.

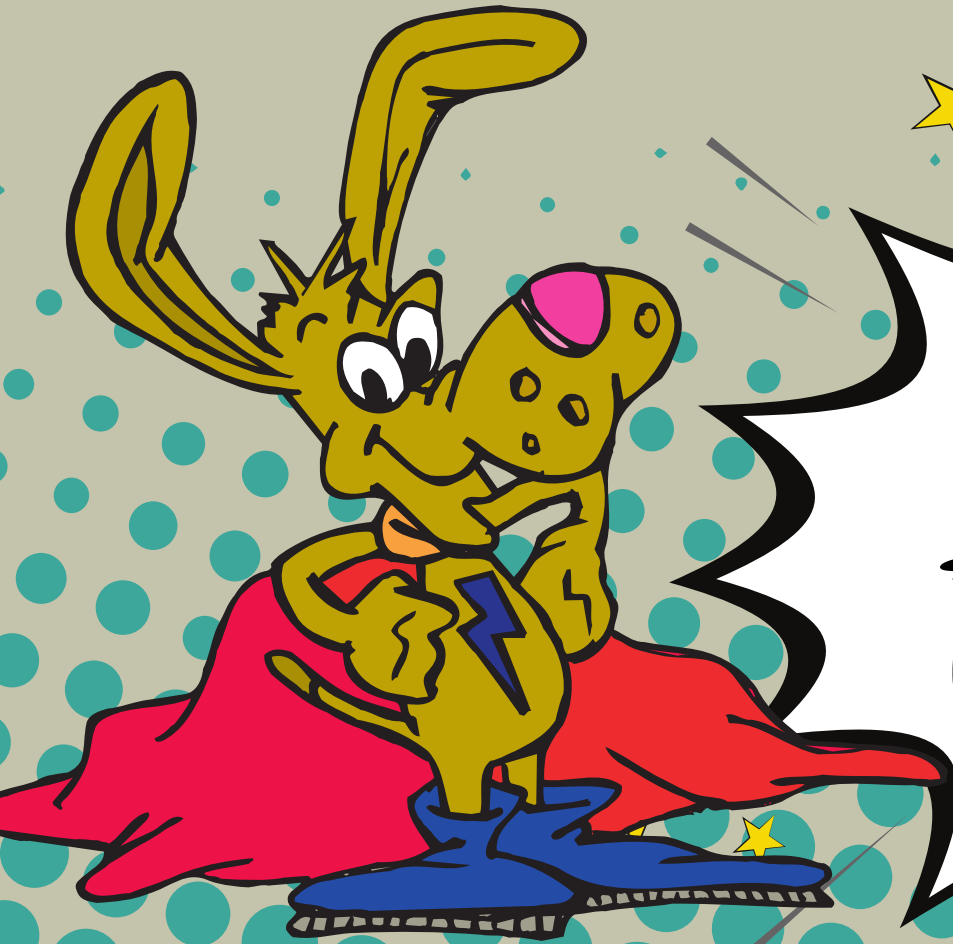
Sports - Vocabulary

Sportsmanship

Sportsmanship

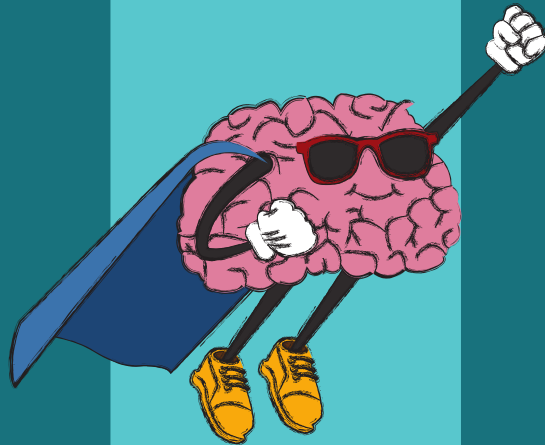
