











championship: a competition that decides who is the best. (noun)

sportsmanship: polite and fair behavior while playing in a game or athletic event. (noun)





Both teams showed very good sportsmanship during the game.



attitude: the way you think and feel about someone or something. (noun)





Her work is very hard, but she keeps a good attitude about it.



halftime: a short rest period between the two parts of a sports game. (noun)





The coach talks to the players at halftime. He wants them to play better in the 2nd half.



Sportsmanship i

Billy is the best player on his soccer team. He practices often and works hard to improve his skills. During the games, Billy seldom passes the ball to his teammates. He gets angry and upset when his teammates make mistakes, and he will even talk to the coach rudely when the team is losing. Billy has scored the most goals for the team this year, but none of his teammates want to be his friend, because of his bad attitude. This year his team has done quite well. They have won 10 games and have only lost 2. Billy's team will play in the **championship** match.
