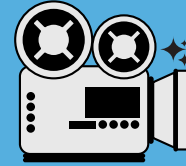

Movies - Vocabulary

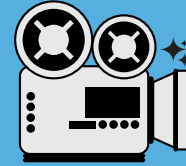


villain: a bad person who harms other people or breaks the law. (noun)

Movies - Vocabulary

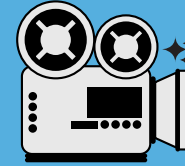


revenge: doing harm to someone because they did something bad first. (noun)

Movies - Vocabulary

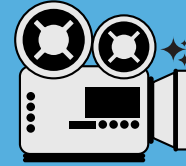


stunt: a dangerous action in a movie that takes a lot of skill (noun)



The action movie had a lot of dangerous **stunts** in it.

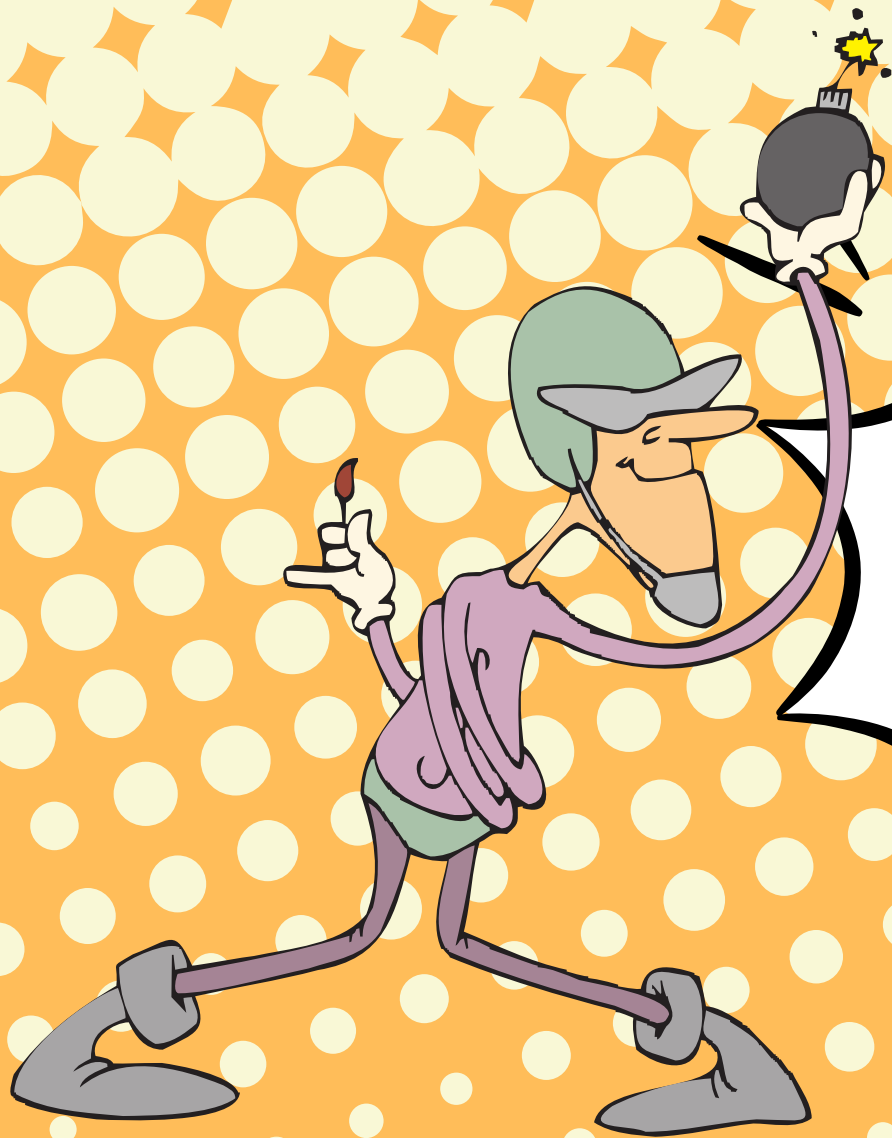
Movies - Vocabulary



cable: a thick, strong rope made of wires that are twisted together. (noun)



The **cables** hold the ship in place so it doesn't move away.

cream?

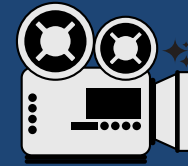




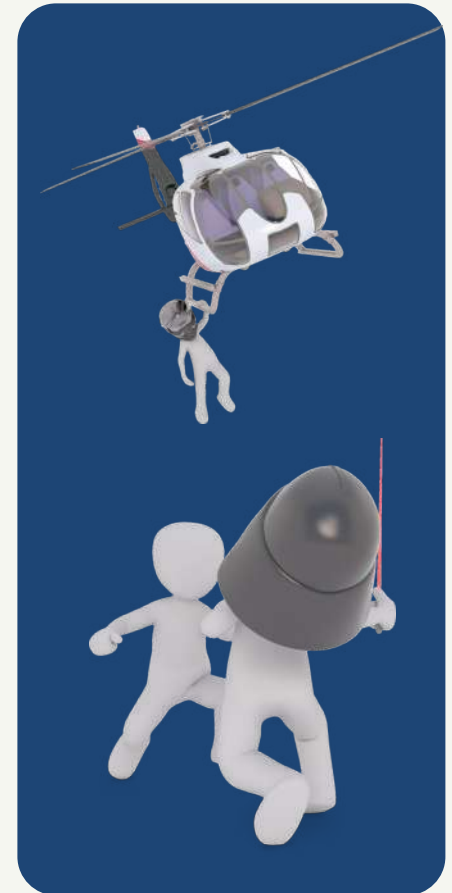

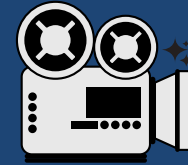
Movies - Vocabulary



One of the most popular movie genres is action. Action movies always have a hero and a **villain**. Usually, something bad happens and the hero wants to get **revenge**. The director will create a story showing the hero trying to track down the villain and stopping him right before he does another terrible deed. A good action movie will have fight scenes and chase scenes. This keeps the movie exciting, but there also has to be a good story between the exciting scenes.



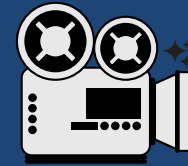

Finally, at the end of action movies, you have a final battle between the good guys and bad guys. Almost always the good guys will win and everyone will be happy. If an action movie is popular, they will make many more using the same characters.

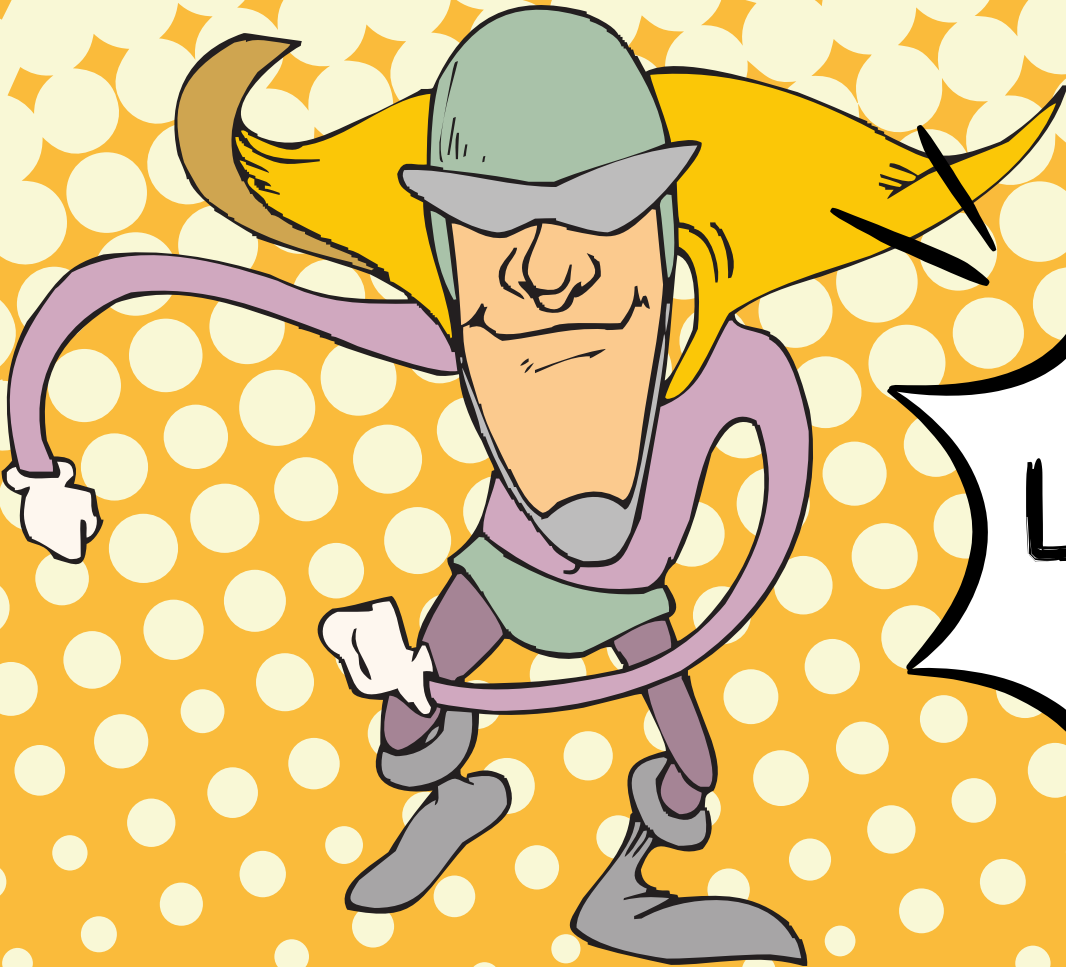

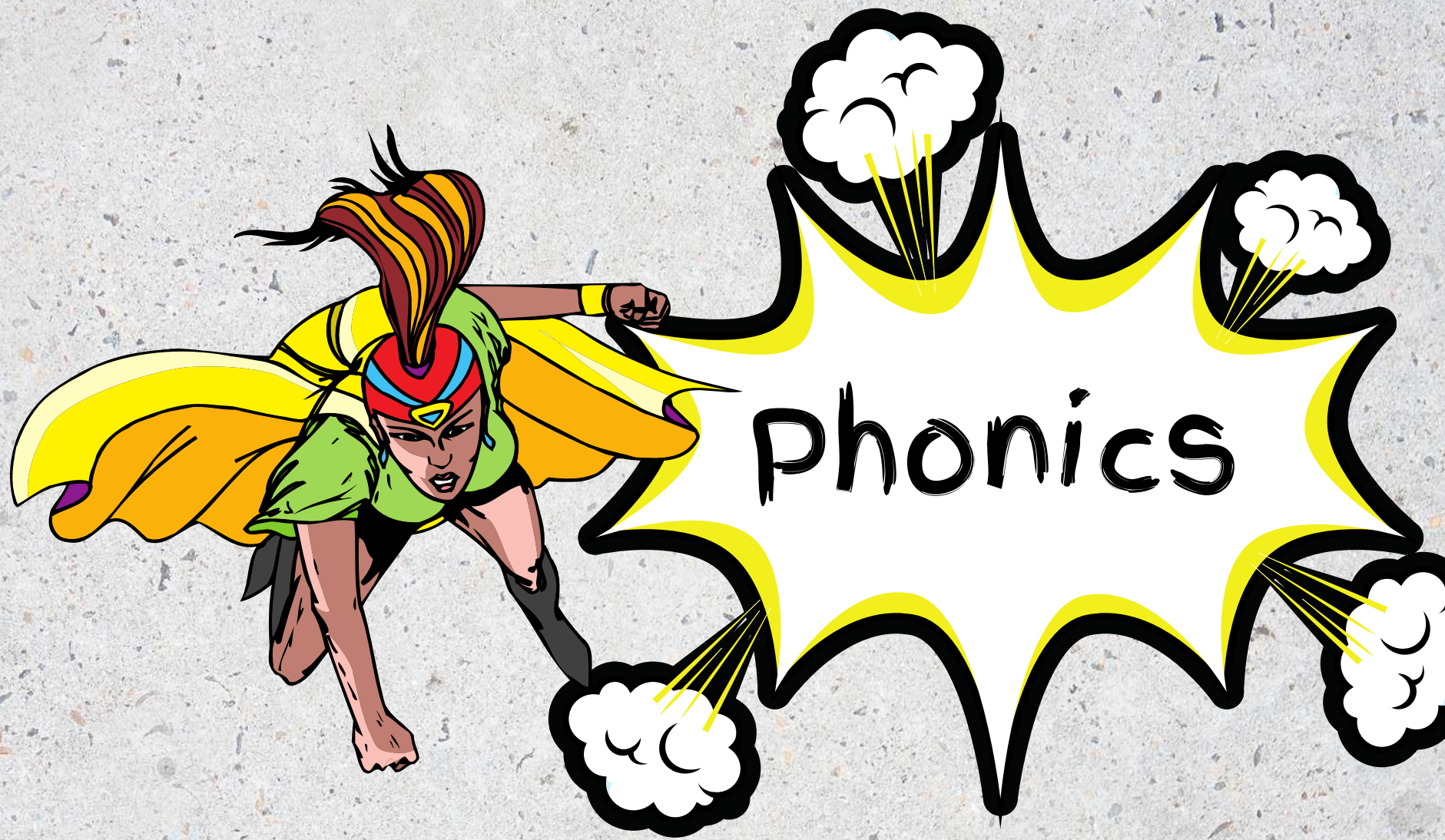


Action movies are made by people doing dangerous **stunts**. Sometimes the actors will do the stunts themselves, but most of the time, they are done by stuntmen. Doing this is very dangerous work, so it takes a lot of training and practice to do it safely. Some action scenes are made with computers, but directors prefer to do things with real people as much as possible. They will use special equipment like **cables** that hold the actors and stuntmen to make things look real. All of this costs a lot of money to do.

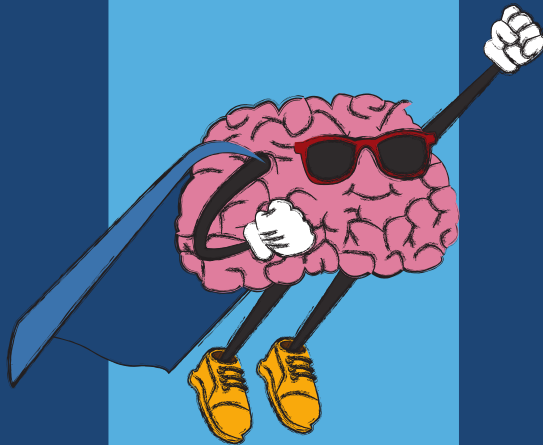
