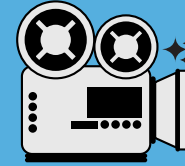

Movies - Vocabulary

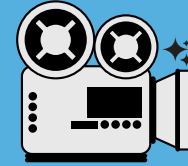


box office: the place in a theater or cinema where you buy tickets. (noun)

Movies - Vocabulary

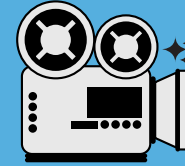


in line: standing in a row waiting for your turn.

Movies - Vocabulary

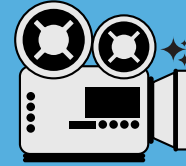


snack bar: a place where snacks are sold.

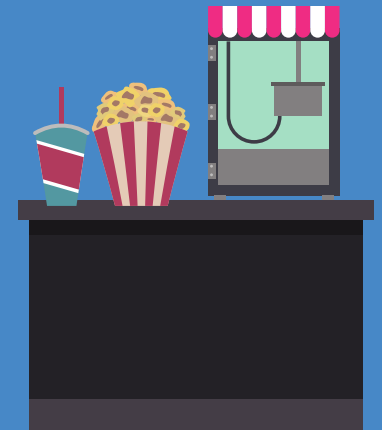
Movies - Vocabulary



Millions of people get in line at movie theaters to watch movies every week around the world. It is usually great fun and much different than watching a movie at home. You get a much bigger screen, much louder sound, great snacks, and many other people enjoying the same movie around you.

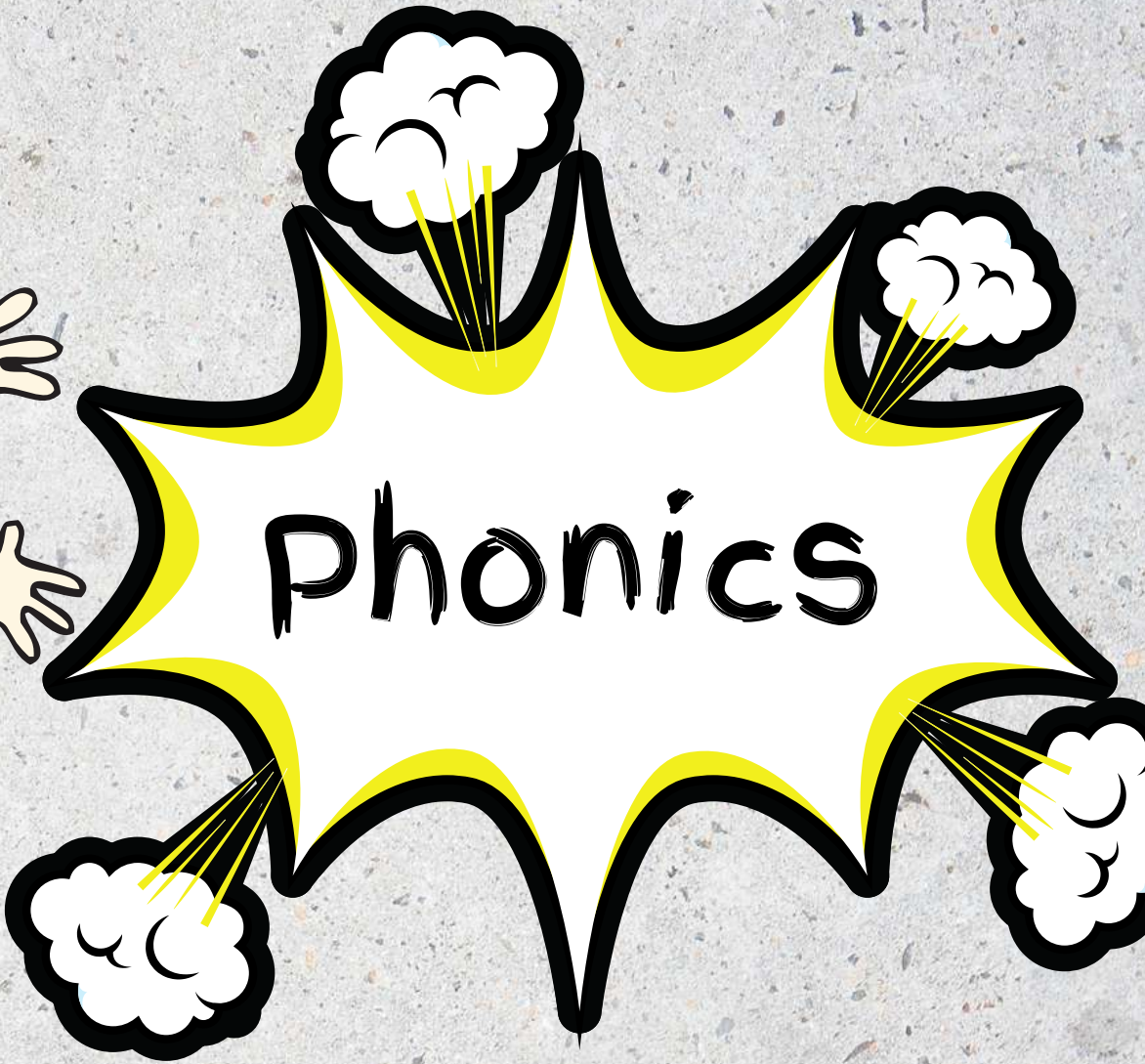
