



Dog - Vocabulary



Collar: A strap around an animal's neck that is used to attach a lead. (noun)



Andrew put a **collar** around his dog's neck so that they could go for a walk.



Dog - Vocabulary



pet: to touch an animal gently and kindly with your hand (verb)



Our dog loves to be **petted** and tickled behind the ears.



Dog - Vocabulary



obey: to do what you have been asked or ordered to do by someone (verb)



The dog would **obey** the woman and sit when she told it to.



Dog - Vocabulary



growl: to make a low, rough sound, usually in anger (verb)



The dog **growled** every time someone came near it.



Dog - Vocabulary



paw: an animal's foot having claws and pads.
(noun)



The dog would raise its **paw** when it wanted some food.

We use should/shouldn't to give advice or to make a suggestion.

You should exercise often.
(it's a good idea)



You should feed the dog.
(it's important)
