# Pet - Vocabulary

# Pet - Vocabulary



**tame:** not wild or dangerous. (adj);  
to make a wild animal domestic. (verb)



He wasn't worried because the tiger is **tame**.  
She tried to **tame** the squirrel.

# Pet - Vocabulary



**natural:** as found in nature and not involving anything made or done by people. (adj)



Wild animals do better in their **natural** habitats.

# Pet - Vocabulary



**survive:** continue to live or exist, especially after almost dying. (verb)



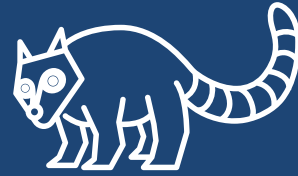
The man was attacked by a shark but was able to **survive**.
