Milestones Continue This Week - It feels good to pray for others by name, but sometimes we feel the urge to share significant things going on in our lives. We are setting aside a moment in worship for you to share milestones during our regular announcements. What's a milestone? Perhaps it's an answer to prayer. Maybe it's a significant anniversary or birthday. Maybe it's a thanksgiving for where you saw God at work recently. If you have a milestone, come ready to share!

<u>Life on Earth</u> - To describe the experience of the redeemed, the poem in Jeremiah speaks of brooks of water in the desert. For Christians, poetry about water always recalls the life granted in baptism. But this poetry can lead us to think also of natural brooks of water, of their scarcity, of the people who live far distant from water sources, of climate change that will lessen the availability of streams of water.

Connections with the Liturgy - A hymn most appropriate for this Sunday is "Amazing grace, how sweet the sound." Its author John Newton was master of a slave-trading ship, until under the influence of the evangelical preacher George Whitefield he became an abolitionist and later an Anglican priest. Newton composed this hymn, one of the most well-known Christian songs throughout the world, in response to his meditation on 1 Chronicles 17:16-17, where King David praises God for mercy. Grace is God's blessing on undeserving wretches like us.

<u>Special Offering Envelopes</u> - If you give by envelope, once every two months there is an envelope designated as "Special Offering." These offerings support endeavors beyond the regular ministries of First Lutheran. October offerings support the Decorating Committee.
