Suraiya's love for Jehangir leads to a heartbreaking plot twist to an end. Ax Momin's selfless friend and support support friend Daoud Momin and fiance Aks. Master calligraphy teacher Ibrahim Momin, her mentor in life. The plot twist at the end shows that it is also part of the tangled story of Husn-e-Jahan. Husn-e-Jahan life surrounds around Taha and then Alb-i-Momin. She understands the Sultan's feelings for her, but is absolutely helpless and cannot regain her feelings.
