

2ND VICE PRESIDENT PROGRAMS AND WORKSHOPS BY BARBRA RILEY

The September General Meeting will be an in-person meeting in the outdoor Plaza area of Ehlers Event Center. Our speaker will be Steve Shulman from Sewing Machine Repair, talking about an ergonomically sound, comfortable sewing space.

This will be a busy meeting, with lots of show and tell, door prizes, a new challenge, and the first “face to face” meeting since June. Don’t forget your name tag!

The workshop for September will also be an in-person event in the Picasso Room. Jo Mellis, a former Acacia member, will teach her version of paper piecing that does not involve sewing through the paper, which means you can reuse the patterns without making multiple copies. She plans to be at our September meeting to show everyone the easy, quick, “puppy” mug rug that will be taught at her workshop. The cost of the workshop will be \$10.00, with the total amount collected going (at Jo’s request) to the Seal Beach Animal Care Center. Members of QBS will also be invited to this workshop, so sign up early to insure a space.

The October meeting will again be by Zoom. The speaker has not yet been signed to a contract, so please stay tuned to the blast for further updates.

We are sharing workshops with QBS in October and November. The October 9th 3 hour workshop will be conducted by our own Caroline Carpenter who will show us how to design our own paper pieced pattern. (If we do a puppy mug rug in September, shouldn’t we also do a cat mug rug?) The charge will be our usual \$25.00.






Previously submitted quilts:

As some of you may know, Mary Ann did not avoid using fabric with polyester if she liked the print or the sheen of a fabric. Barbara chose this quilt top from a picture (thank you, Covid) and was not aware of this possible problem. The black fabric could not be ironed flat. She solved that problem by basting the back before starting to hand quilt the top. Barbara has not yet attended any of our Zoom meetings, but she has obviously been thinking of us, possibly not always good thoughts. Great work, Barbara!

The flange binding was done by Phyllis Victor. Both women deserve extra kudos for this one!





Tea and Quilt Auction 2022

Additional quilts:

All quilts submitted for the tea, both live auction and silent auction, will be eligible for a special drawing on March 3, 2022, our general meeting that month. Several of the last few fabric donations to Acacia have included some very nice batiks. Originally, we were collecting the batiks for a “batik basket” at the tea. Some will now be given to the name drawn in March from those who donated quilts to be auctioned at the tea. (One quilt accepted for the tea, one ticket in the jar.) There will be a partial display of these batiks at the September 2nd in person General Meeting. There are so many batiks that there will be a similar drawing for philanthropy quilts.

Volunteers Needed:

The Tea and Auction is a major undertaking and needs the participation of everyone. With planning for future events even more difficult than usual, this is more important than ever. Your ideas would also be appreciated. We are small, we need everyone.

The next tea meeting will be on August 26th (by Zoom) and the fourth Thursday of every month until April. At the August Tea meeting we will be considering the list of baskets. Shar has a list of baskets that have been a success at past teas, but ideas for others are welcome. She will be starting a list of those committing to a specific basket at the September General Meeting and will have some sample lists of what was included in previous baskets.

Jelly Roll Challenge

Acacia's newest challenge is aimed at using some of the fabric strips that we have acquired. Many of the fabric donations we have received included 2 ½ strips. Some of it is selvage to selvage, some of it left over binding, some of it just pieces.

The goal is to make philanthropy quilts with some of these strips that are taking up space in the storage unit. In this case, you are not required to donate the results of your efforts. If you make something you just love, or your granddaughter loves it, you can keep it. We just want the fabric made into something useful!

Only the width of fabric (WOF) strips have been used for this challenge. The strips were grouped, 10 strips per bag, according to color. Some packs have 10 strips of the same color, some have eight of the same color and two of a similar color, and some have several different prints with a similar color.

The rules are: Take 3 packets of 10 WOF strips (totaling 30 WOF strips), one from group "A", which has pale or neutral strips and two additional packets of your choice. You are not required to use all the strips, just the majority and you can add to the fabric taken for this challenge.

Use any pattern you choose.

A finished quilt, minimum size of 40 inches by 55 inches, must be finished by the November meeting and turned in by the November Fabricators meeting on November 13th.

Judging will be by vote of those present by zoom at the November General meeting. Prizes will be announced at the September meeting.

Note: Quilts to be donated to Thomas House by Christmas are collected during November. This challenge is intended to increase that number.

CONCERTS IN THE PARK



FABRICATORS BY BARBRA RILEY

The Fabricators met on Saturday, August 22nd to find backings and cut batting for some of the quilt tops from Mary Ann West, as well as dispense and collect philanthropy kits.

Phyllis Victor, Barbra, Sonia, Shar, and Brenda also sorted through some of the fabric recently donated by the husband of the late Ardith Mahle. Several pieces were found that coordinated with quilt tops done by Mary Ann. A few other members came by to drop off items for philanthropy. Raquel Licea, one of our newer members, dropped off her very first philanthropy quilt top, one of the crazy 9 patch kits.

The recent donation of fabric is so large that only a portion of it has been looked at. Ardith had very good taste in fabric and every piece of her fabric was labeled with the date of purchased, the cost per yard, and the amount of fabric. So far, we have found 75 yards of batiks. We expect to go through and organize more of this donation next month.

Before the boxes of recently donated fabric were returned to the storage unit, 149 yards were donated to Mary Clements to make Happy Hats for children facing surgery. She was very pleased with the donation because she says her usual source of fabric seems to be drying up. We are always happy to share any juvenal or cheerful, bright colored prints with Mary. The scraps from her 19 inch circles, which she shares with Acacia, have also made over 100 cute mask. (If we are going to be wearing masks for the foreseeable future, they can at least be made from cute fabric!)

The next Fabricators meeting will also be held in the Plaza of Ehlers Event Center on September 11th from 10:00 am until 3:00pm. Everyone is welcome.

SUPER SENIOR SATURDAY AUGUST 2021

Super Senior Saturday is a community event providing information on various services and community groups to the seniors of Buena Park and surrounding cities.



Past President Barbra Riley sent a card thanking the guild for their gifts celebrating her third year as President.

Philanthropy Committee Update **Sonia Das, Barbra Riley, and Phyllis Victor**

Acacia Quilt Guild makes quilts, Xmas stockings, and pillowcases to distribute to the community including Thomas House, a homeless family transitional living facility in Garden Grove, the Buena Park Police Department, the Navigation Center which serves the homeless in Buena Park and other charities.

We would like to ask the guild members to help make more of these items as the end of the year is coming and we need these to distribute.

Quilts, Stockings, and Pillowcases

- Acacia has 24 quilt kits complete with the batting and backing for each quilt top.
- Acacia has several stocking and pillowcase kits available members to finish (all fabric provided)
- Please contact the committee for a kit or request a kit through the website.

Stocking Stuffers

- In October, we will reach out to Thomas House for a list of resident and graduate children. Once we know the ages, we can begin the process of sorting and filling the stockings.
- In November, we will fill the stockings with the goodies donated by guild members
- In December, we plan (if all is safe) to invite Thomas House representatives to come and receive the stockings and other donations
- We have some leftover stocking stuffers from 2020 but based on last year's numbers, we will need to acquire more.
- Last year we filled 93 stockings – 49 of which were for those 13+ in age
- Please consider picking up stocking stuffers as you are out and about. A list will go out in future newsletters and will be on the website.
- For those who are staying at home, Sonia will be happy to collect funds and go shopping on your behalf.
- Last year, generous guild members donated \$610 to purchase items – thank you!!





Prep: 5 minutes

Cook: 20 minutes

2 cups flour
4 teaspoons baking powder
1/4 teaspoon salt
1 tablespoon ginger
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon allspice
2 eggs, beaten
4 tablespoons brown sugar
4 tablespoons molasses
1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 3/4 cups milk
1/2 cup vegetable oil

Instructions:

Turn on the waffle iron to heat. In a large bowl, mix dry ingredients. Stir in remaining ingredients and mix until batter is smooth and is an even color.

Spray the waffle iron with cooking spray or coat with vegetable oil. Pour batter onto hot iron and cook until golden.
