While most large companies nowadays write sustainability reports to report on their sustainability activities and communicate with their stakeholders, the higher education sector tends to be lagging behind. Universities generally find it challenging to report on their environmental and social impacts. How can they start reporting?

We will present recent research on the topic and will discuss with the participants which sustainability information they think really matters for university stakeholders.
