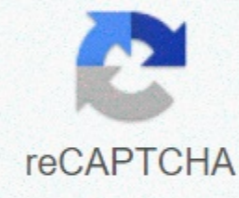

If you need to hand over number plates, you can now do so at a Dropbox in the front room of the Rath Building, 95 Franklin Street, Buffalo NY. You'll need to bring your own pen to fill in a plate handover envelope that you can use to drop your plates over the drop box. The Erie County DMV offers limited for essential workers who need to register a new vehicle or transfer an licence. Senior Services: Congregate food locations are closed and switch to Densonten at home. Senior Services also coordinates the training of family/close contacts of seniors as Medicaid home care workers, support for seniors with health insurance applications, and transportation for dialysis appointments. Call (716) 218-1400. DSS: All non-emergency customer appointments at the Erie County Department of Social Services will be suspended. Assistance for personal assistance is limited to people with emergencies such as homelessness, displacement, segregated care and immediate shortage of food. Childcare The 35% family share is waived for families affected by COVID-19. Erie County will make payments to childcare providers and program types: (day care, group family, family, legally exempt group, and school-age childcare) on behalf of a child who is temporarily absent from childcare because of the circumstances caused by the child's quarantine due to the effects of child care. for 30 days. Effective April 1, 2020, Erie County will increase the maximum total number of allowed absences to a total of 30 absences for all childcare providers and program types on behalf of an eligible child who is temporarily out of child care due to COVID-19. Erie Erie The childcare programme will expand eligibility standards to serve families with an income of up to 85% of the state median income (SMI). The Workforce Development Institute (WDI) Child Care Facilitated Enrollment program will accept new applications ranging from 201% of FPL to 85% of SMI. Another executive order of 27 March extended the validity of all vehicle safety inspections that will take place on or after 27 March. DSS: It is important that all customers include a working phone number so that you can be contacted by phone for an interview. DSS prioritizes emergency funds, temporary housing and HEAP assistance. Public aid - Personal interviews for public aid are suspended and the Office goes to telephone interviews to determine the eligibility of public aid. Applicants may submit new applications for temporary assistance (2921) to the Agency by post or fax (585) 753-5315. The application should clearly indicate which programmes the applicant applies for.
