Advancing understanding of racism-related health disparities beginning before birth: A multisite study with Black and Latina pregnant women

The purpose of this study is to examine whether experiences of racism prenatally affect fetal health and development through a process of “biological embedding” of racism measured daily during pregnancy. The proposed multi-site and rigorously-designed longitudinal research aims to advance understanding of racism-related health disparities as well as modifiable stress-buffering factors in pregnant Black and Latina women and infants.
