MINUTES**

1. Open the Meeting and Determination of Quorum

Chair Richard Daunt called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. and determined a quorum.

2. Adoption of Agenda

Delegate Becker made a ***motion*** to adopt the agenda as presented. The ***motion*** passed with a unanimous vote.

3. Approve Regular Meeting Minutes

a. March 26, 2026

Delegate Fuller made a ***motion*** to approve the minutes as presented. The ***motion*** passed with a unanimous vote.

4. Public Comments

Joel Down - Wesley Chapel

Mr. Down was concerned about Senate Bill 214 which allowed Franklin County to acquire property in other counties and the precedent that it set. He also encouraged all to visit the newly built mini golf course in Wesley Chapel's Dogwood Park.

Sarah Joel - Weddington

Ms. Joel was curious how WUMA came up with resolutions as they seemed mismatched to the opinion of her community. *Delegates explained to Ms. Joel that WUMA did not pass resolutions but rather the WUMA Delegates brought regional concerns to the various municipal elected bodies for consideration.*

5. Delegate and Municipality Reports

Rick Becker (Mineral Springs) - Delegate Becker reported that there was no notable news to report on within the town as they were busy with budget.

Amanda Fuller (Wesley Chapel) - Delegate Fuller reported that Wesley Chapel was having a grand opening of its mini golf course at Dogwood Park the upcoming weekend. There would also be a mini golf tournament. The public could sign up on the town's facebook page. She also reported: 1) the village had passed a resolution opposing the addition of fluoride in the water; and 2) the village had no prior knowledge of the hospital coming near Wesley Chapel prior to the hospital's announcement.

Richard Daunt (Waxhaw) - Chair Daunt had the following to share:

- Waxhaw was working on the CIP for the next five years in addition to the budget. Debate was on going about the possibility of selling some town owned properties.
- Waxhaw had also passed the resolution against the addition of fluoride to support the current NC and SC bills that were focused on discontinue the practice.
- Waxhaw was in discussions about a resolution to support impact fees.

David Scholl (Stallings) - Delegate Scholl reported the following for Stallings:

- Stallings Mayor Pro Tem Brad Richardson was the Chair of CRTPO.
- Stallings Mayor Scholl was the Chair of CRC.
- Stallings was concerned about the possible property tax cap bill that was going through the House as a constitutional amendment. NCLM was helping to coordinate those opposition efforts. CRC Day in May would also have a coordinated effort in opposition to the subject.

6. Old Business

Delegate Fuller (Wesley Chapel) thought WUMA should have another State Official Meeting. The last one was done in May 2025.

7. New Business

Delegate Scholl (Stallings) encouraged all the attend City Vision in May as it was a good opportunity to lobby legislatures and network.

8. Delegate Comments

Chair Daunt (Waxhaw) stated that the CRC was a great help with the Waxhaw Annual Retreat.

9. Adjournment

Delegate Fuller made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 4:40 p.m. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.
