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Special education counsellors work with special education teachers and/or therapists to teach children with emotional and behavioural disorders, intellectual disabilities, communication problems or physical disabilities. Special education aid works with children individually or in small group environments. Working under the supervision of a therapist or special education teacher, assistants use methods such as games and exercises to help children develop physically and behaviorally. One of the main job functions of a special education aid is to provide support to the teacher in a classroom setting. While the other duties of an aid may vary depending on the needs of the students, all assistants can expect to work directly with teachers on tasks such as lesson and document planning. Special education aid is also invoked to help students in the classroom with physical demands, such as eating, caring and toileting. Most importantly, aid provides a safe environment and prevents students from hurting themselves or others. Career growth Career growth expected for all teachers' assistants, including special education assistants, is 9%. Special education counsellors who have two or more years of post-secondary education and those with varied professional experience are likely to have better career opportunities. Aid that speaks a foreign language will have an advantage as well. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the average salary for all teachers' assistants, including special education assistants, is \$24,000. With additional experience and education, career advancement opportunities will be possible. Special education counsellors can move at a faster pace by seeking specialized training to better equip them to support students with disabilities. Education requirements Students interested in becoming special education assistants should complete an associated bachelor's program. Some states require additional aptitude tests for people working with students with special needs. Perspective aids should have a general understanding of physical, cognitive and developmental disabilities. Employers usually prefer to hire aid with at least two years of experience working with children - but this experience can be formal or informal. Workplace training for assistants will involve an immersion in the rules and operations of the school in which they work, plus a full profile of each student and his needs. Special skills and qualifications Nature of working with students with special needs requires aid to be able to manage situations and stressful everyday. In addition to compassion, patience and understanding, assistants must be able to easily adapt and listen carefully to the detailed instructions provided by teachers, as many teaching methods are used in special education classrooms. Above-average communication skills – including speech and writing skills - are required. Aid must always remain calm under pressure. Knowledge of different cultural environments is a plus, especially if an aid intends to work in an urban area. In most states, aid must pass a background check before it is hired. Special education teacher assistants provide direct support to both special education teachers and inclusive classroom students. This role balances the direct assistance of students with everyday tasks, would be the eating and use of the bath, as well as the educational tasks, such as the development of the curriculum and the adaptation of lesson plans and classroom materials to suit the specific needs of the students. Special education teacher assistants shall also ensure that their classrooms and lessons comply with the school curriculum developed by the school or state district and keep the pupils' records in collaboration with the special education teacher. They can also teach special education classrooms where the teacher is absent and conducts classroom activities to build social and behavioral skills. Assistant Teacher of Special Education Duties and ResponsibilitiesThe special education teacher's assistant may vary from day to day, but most share several basic responsibilities:Development of curriculum and lesson plansOne of the most important tasks of a special education teacher assistant works with teachers to develop lesson plans that meet the educational standards and specific needs of students in the classroom. In this aspect of the role, the special education teacher's assistant examines classroom materials and takes students into account, providing information and advice to the teacher during the preparation of the lesson plan to ensure the students' success. Providing one-on-one Student AssistanceSpecial Assistants for Education Teachers also provides direct support to students, which can include helping with socialization and everyday tasks, would be eating, using the bathroom, or using classroom materials. This part of the job may involve significant physical activity, it would be a help a student with limited mobility using the toilet or assisting a student who has trouble eating on his own. Adaptation of materials and classroom activities Special assistants of education teachers work with students, parents and teachers to adapt materials and activities in the classroom in specific needs of the student. They can develop worksheets that help the student better understand the learning material, include visual aids to help a student understand a lesson, or develop activities to help students learn successfully. Monitoring student progress and performance Student observation and reporting is another important part of the role of the special education teacher's assistant. They can observe the students of the day day and take notes on their successes and challenges in the class. In addition, special education teacher assistants prepare and report on student results, giving them to the district or parents to demonstrate the student's progress. Maintaining classroom organisation and safetyABy maintaining special assistants of education teachers keep classrooms clean, safe and efficient by monitoring organisation and safety. This may include cleaning the classroom at the end of the day, resolving conflicts between students and setting and applying standards for classroom behavior. The special education teacher's assistant also prepares reports on any incidents in the classroom. Lead Classroom ActivitiesFrom day to day, the special education teacher's assistant can conduct a variety of classroom activities designed to build students' social, behavioral and mental health. These activities may include games and social opportunities for students with disabilities, such as autism, or physical education activities tailored for students with physical disabilities. The special education teacher's assistant can also teach lessons if the teacher is absent. Special Education Teachers Skills and Qualifications AssistantSpecial teachers provide daily support in classrooms with inclusive and special education. School districts tend to hire candidates with a high school diploma, some college credits, and the following skills:Assessing students – special education teacher assistants provide support by identifying the specific needs of students, so that they have a certain knowledge of student assessment and determining what they need to succeed in helping physically – many special education teacher assistants directly support students with physical tasks , would be eating or using the bath, so they should have some experience in providing support services for people with disabilities Development of the degree – special education teacher assistants work directly with teachers to develop and adapt curricular materials to the specific needs of students, so that they should have some skills with the development of lessonsClassroom management – many of the tasks of a special education teacher assistant involve managing the class to ensure that the needs of the students students are also addressed to solve behavioural or social problemsOrganizational skills - in this role, special education teacher assistants maintain the cleanliness and organization of the classroom while managing the day-to-day programs, so that they should be very organizedCommunication skills - Special education teachers should also be strong written and verbal communicators, as they interact with students, teachers and parentsThe education and training students special assistants of education teachers need at least one high school diploma. Although a college degree is not required for this role, special education teacher assistants need to complete some college courses, usually equivalent to two years of full-time training. In many cases, school districts prefer to hire candidates with an associate degree in education. Experience in the classroom is also helpful, so is the experience of working with people with mental or physical disabilities. Special Education Teacher Assistant Salary and OutlookAlthough the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) does not provide specific information for special education teacher assistants, it has collected salary data for teacher assistants as a whole. According to BLS, teachers' assistants earn an average annual salary of \$26,260. The highest-paid teaching assistants earn more than \$39,780 a year, while the lowest-paid 10 percent earn less than \$18,460. BLS also notes that about a third of teaching assistants work part-time. BLS expects employment for teaching assistants to grow by 8% by 2026, which is as fast as the average.
