Comprehensive Plan Update

The Comprehensive Plan:

- Officially adopted document prescribed by the PA Municipalities Planning Code
- Establishes a framework for future growth and development in a responsible, sustainable manner
- Articulates community consensus, a common direction
- Serves as a basis for future decision-making
- Establishes realistic, practical strategies

Strategies typically involve:

- Community facilities
- Infrastructure
- Public services
- Economic development
- Connectivity
- Land use
- Housing

Major phases

Community Snapshot

Collecting context, laying the groundwork

To involve:

ArcGIS mapping of baseline conditions and changing trends, assessment of existing plans, data analysis

Visioning and Needs Assessment

Identifying key issues, distilling themes, collecting data and comments to validate findings, finding consensus

To involve:

Branding the plan, intensive and creative outreach, involvement of Steering Committee, elected and appointed leaders, citizens and stakeholders in visioning exercises and prioritizing focus topics. Additional research to accurately frame issue and options, set up recommendations, field work to verify findings.

Implementation Plan

Delivering practical instructions with schedules, cost estimates, potential partners and funders

To involve:

Benchmarks and practical how-to details, opinions of probable cost, funding source ideas and tips, timelines, conceptual plans, engagement of community partners

Project history:

- Monthly Steering Committee meetings kicked off July 2018
- Outreach events: July 4 Spectacular, Farmers Market, Community Day, Flood Relief Festival, October Town Hall, BPSD Youth Focus Group, Gold Card Club Valentine's Event, Corridor Focus Group

Other outreach

- Interviews/meetings throughout: Municipal departments, service providers, Chamber, churches, Industrial Park, Rotary, Montour Trail Council
- Surveys and project updates on BlueprintBethelPark.com (three surveys so far, 869 digital responses + paper)

Current draft vision:

Bethel Park will strive to provide an inclusive, safe and well-connected community, governed by a culture of professionalism, that fosters economic development and innovation, protects and enhances environmental resources and respects local heritage while addressing the challenges of the future.

- Qualities of residents and interpersonal relations:
 - Educated, healthy, involved citizenry
 - Sense of community
 - People, trust, belonging, togetherness

Current draft objectives:

- A transportation network enhanced by increased connectivity and intelligent system management, with more safe and viable alternatives to driving
- An attractive, walkable downtown area with commercial diversity and regional draw
- Continued investment in capital improvements and public facilities and services that enhance quality of life
- A strong and diverse local economy
- Established protection and enhancement of open space and natural resources

The plan will be practical:

- Public and Steering Committee will identify priorities
- Mackin will provide practical background, estimates of probable cost, feasibility analysis where possible (example: traffic analysis to support lane reconfiguration recommendations)
- Recommendations will include benchmarks, funding sources, potential partner agencies


What's next?
