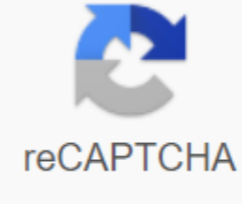

Challenge 2 contributes twice as much as Task 1's writing score. IELTS Writing Task 1 in The first part, you are given a job based on some graphic or scenic information. You must write a descriptive report of at least 150 words on the information provided. IELTS Writing Challenge 2 The second task is more challenging. You should prepare a written argument on the topic and organize your response clearly, considering some examples to support your points. You will have to write at least 250 words and as a task 2 is larger than Task 1, you are advised to spend about 40 minutes on this task and 20 minutes on the first task. IELTS General Writing If you plan to take the GT module, the writing test is different. You are allowed one hour to complete two tasks, of 150 and 250 words, as in the academic module. However, Challenge 1 is always writing, while the challenge is 2 essays based on the theme. IELTS Writing Task 1 - Academic IELTS Sample Chart (IELTS Writing Task 1) Writing Task 1 academic IELTS test requires you to write a resume of at least 150 words in response to a specific graph (bar, line or pie chart), table, chart, or process (how something works, how something is done). This task tests your ability to select and report basic functions, describe and compare data, identify meanings and trends in factual information, or describe the process. IELTS Writing Tasks 1 - Common IELTS Sample Letters (IELTS Writing Task 1) The purpose of this section is to help you with writing Task 1 of the IELTS General Test. In Task 1, candidates are asked to respond to a question with a letter requesting information or clarification. It is assumed that the task 1 spends about 20 minutes, which requires candidates to write at least 150 words. Depending on the task, candidates are judged on their ability: - to engage in personal correspondence - to request and provide general factual information - to express needs, desires, sympathies and dislikes - to express opinions (views, complaints, etc.) IELTS Writing Task 2 IELTS Writing Task 2 (IELTS Sample Essay) IELTS Writing Task 2 requires you to write at least 250 words. You will be presented with a topic and will be tested on your ability to respond by giving and justifying an opinion, discussing the topic, summarizing the details, describing problems, identifying possible solutions and supporting what you write with reasons, arguments and relevant examples from your own knowledge or experience. The Score Task 2 has more weight in marking than Task 1. The letter's scripts are marked by trained and certified IELTS examiners who are qualified as a teacher and are recruited as test centres and approved by the British Council or IELTS Australia. Topics in these tasks are related to areas of common interest and are suitable for students enrolled in undergraduate and postgraduate studies or seeking professional registration. The answers to both tasks must be written in a formal style. Challenge 1 You will

be presented with a graph, table, chart or diagram and invited to describe, summarize or explain the information in their own words. You may be asked to describe and submit data, describe the stages of the process, how something works, or describe an object, plan, or design. Challenge 2 you will be asked to write an essay in response to a point of view, argument or problem. You will support your point of view with relevant examples from your own knowledge and experience. In IELTS Academic Writing Task 1, you'll see a diagram, a visual way of presenting information. You may be shown one or more diagrams. This visual information can be shown as: Table Chart Process Chart Map You will also be given instructions to summarize the information you see by selecting and communicating the basic functions that you see by making comparisons where appropriate. You will need to give the task of transmitting information - the visual information that you are given, should be presented in the form of text. To successfully complete the task you will need: Write an introduction Write a review (summary of what you see) Present time and highlight key features with numbers (data) you will need to write at least 150 words and the answers must be written in full, without bullet points or notes. In Task 2 of the academic writing test, you are asked to write an essay in response to a point of view, argument, or problem. Essays must be written in academic or semi-official clothing. Topics are devoted to topical issues and focus on a specific aspect of the topic. For example, if the topic is about computers, the focus will be on a specific aspect rather than writing about computers in general. Task instructions give you information about the issue by telling you how to discuss the topic in your essay. You may be asked to provide factual information, outlines and submit solutions, substantiate your opinion or evaluate evidence and ideas. It is important that you carefully complete the task by using appropriate ideas and examples to support your position. Your ideas should be organized clearly using paragraphs for each idea. You must write at least 250 words. You are judged on your ability to follow English essays writing conventions to organize and reference information in a consistent way, using language accurately and appropriately to express your ideas and opinions.
