Green University 2.0: SDGs-Inside

(1) Institutional Environment:

-SDGs are integrated into university organization and operations, affecting university culture and surrounding areas

(2) Research:

- Assisting the society in aware of localized SDGs issues and development solutions
- -Promote teachers to engage in SDGs research
- -Organizing seminars on sustainable development

(3) Education:

- Empower citizens with sustainable concept
- Cooperate with non-profit organizations for workshops.
- Encourage teachers to apply SDG into existing course contents.
- Encourage students to work with sister schools to discuss SDGs issues.

(4) External Practice and Partnership:

-Linking domestic and foreign universities and organizations to carry out cross-sector cooperation activities

NUK cooperates with overseas universities









- Cooperated with University of Oviedo in **Spain** and Matsuyama University in **Japan** to open 4 international joint dual degree courses.
- 2 lecturers and 7 students from the NKU participated, and 12 lecturers and 28 students from the sister school participated.



- Provide scholarships for disadvantaged Indonesian students to come to Taiwan.







Extend the period of one-off contract for the outstanding faculties

Pass the appraisal in the ending of the contract, the employment period will be extended.



Encourage departments to open off-campus internship courses for students

- List the internship course as one of the compulsory courses.
- Encourage students to go to Japan, Korea, Vietnam and other countries for internships.
- More than 200 students work off-campus every academic year.
