He has authored more than 30 books about Christianity, including the Cold Medal of publishers association evangelical Christian Association book winner can a man live without God? in the category theology and doctrine as well as Christian bestsellers Light in the Shadow of Jihad and Great Weaver. He was the founder and chairman of the board of international ministries, Ravi zakarias, and the host of Radio Programs Let My People Think and Just Thinking. He was a life minister of the Christian and Missionary Alliance, the Keswick Christian denomination in which he was ordained. The early life and education of zacharia was born on March 26, 1946, in Madras, India, at the age of a minor parent. His family moved to Delhi when he was very young and he grew up there. His family was Anglican, but he was a skeptic until he was 17 when he tried to commit suicide by swallowing poison. While he was in the hospital, a local Christian worker brought him a Bible and told his mother to read him from John 14, which contained the words of Jesus to Apostle Thomas. He said that it was John 14:19 who touched him as the defining paradigm: Because I live, you live too, and that he thought. This may be my only hope: a new way of life. life as defined by the author of life. He committed his life to Christ, praying to Jesus, if you are the one who gives life as it should be, I want it. Please pull me out of this hospital bed well and I promise I will leave no stone unturned in my quest for truth. In 1966, he immigrated with his family to Canada, earning a bachelor's degree from the Bible College of Ontario in 1972 (now Tyndale University) and a master's degree from Trinity International University in 1976. In 1990, he participated in a study at Ridley Hall, Church Theological School in Cambridge. Career Ministry Ravi zakarias speaks with Pastor Joe Coffey in the chapel of the community of Christ about the response to objections to Christianity. He spent the summer of 1971 in South Vietnam, where he evangelizes American soldiers as well as imprisoned members of the Vietnam. After graduating from the Bible College of Ontario, he began itinerant ministries with the Christian and Missionary Alliance (KSM) in Canada. In 1974, KSMA sent him to Cambodia, where he preached only shortly before his fall as a Khmer Rouge. Later, in 1980, he was ordained a SMA, and from 1980 to 1984 he taught at the Alliance Theological Seminary, where he was a professor of evangelism. In 1983, he spoke in Amsterdam at the first Billy Graham Association International Conference of Evangelicals. After Amsterdam, he spent the summer preaching Christianity in India, where he continued to see the need for an apologetic ministry, both to bring people to Christ and to teach Christian leaders. In August 1984, the international ministry of Ravi zacharia was founded in Toronto, Canada, to continue his calling as a classic evangelist in the intellectually sustainable arena. Today, it is headquartered in suburban Atlanta, Georgia. In 1989, shortly after the fall of the Berlin Wall, he spoke in Moscow with students of the Lenin Military Academy, as well as with the political leaders of the Center for Geopolitical Strategy. It was the first of many evangelical events in the political sphere. Future events included events in Bogota, Colombia, in 1993, where he spoke to the judiciary about the importance of having a solid moral foundation. In 1990, he wrote his first book, Destroyed Visage: The Real Face of Atheism. In 1992, he spoke at his first Veritas forum at Harvard University, and later that year he was one of the keynote speakers at Urbana. She continued to be a frequent guest in these forums, both giving lectures and answering students' questions and answers to sessions at academic institutions, including the University of Georgia, the University of Michigan, and the State of Pennsylvania. In 2004, the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints opened its signature pulpit at the Salt Lake Tabernacle for a series of messages. Who is the truth? Defending Jesus Christ as the Path, Truth and Life of approximately 7,000 lay people and scholars from LDS and Protestant camps in the initiator movement for an open dialogue between the camps. Johnson later apologized for this comment. He was a frequent keynote lecturer in the evangelical community at events such as the Future of Truth conference in 2004 and the National Conference on Christian Apologetics in 2005. In October 2007, he addressed first virginia Tech students and faculty and then the community of Blacksburg, Virginia, about evil and suffering after the Virginia massacre. He represented the evangelical community on occasions such as the National Day of Prayer in Washington, D.C., the Annual Prayer Breakfast at the United Nations and the African Union Prayer Breakfast in Maputo, Mozambique, and was named Honorary Chair of the National Prayer Day Task Force 2008. He also attended ecumenical meetings together 2016 in July 2016, at which Pope Francis addressed, describing the event as a valiant effort. He was interviewed on Focus on Family Truth. In November 2009, he signed an ecumenical statement, known as the Manhattan Declaration, which affirms the sanctity of human life, the dignity of marriage as a union between husband and wife, and freedom of religion as fundamental principles of justice and the common good. In 2014, he reprinted his book The Lamb and the Fuhrer, an imaginary conversation between Adolf Hitler, Jesus Christ and Dietrich Bonhoeffer, as a graphic novel. In 2016, Republican presidential candidate Marco Rubio appointed him to the Dignity of Life advisory group. In 2015, according to Form 990's public tax return, he and his wife reported earning a total of \$523,926 from his nonprofit, Ravi zakarias. The worldview of the country argued that a coherent worldview should be able to satisfactorily answer four questions: the origin, the meaning of life, morality and destiny. He said that while every major religion makes exclusive statements about the truth, the Christian faith is unique in its ability to answer all four of these questions. He regularly spoke of the consistency of the Christian worldview, saying that Christianity is capable of the toughest philosophical attacks. He believed that the apologist had to argue with three levels: from logic to make it acceptable; from the senses to make it alive; and whether a person has the right to use it to make moral judgments. The apologetics style of zacharia focused primarily on Christianity's answers to the great existential questions of life with the protection of God. He argued that the dominance of the visual in modern communication systems influenced people's ability to abstract reasoning by changing their way of perceiving things; however, the integration of abstract reasoning into the worldview is essential if its basis is to be based on absolutes rather than on relative feelings and quirks. The use of the title of Doctor In 2017, Christianity Today reported on accusations that he had exaggerated his academic credentials; for example, that he referred to himself in several articles and videos titled Doctor or Doctor, despite lack of doctoral qualifications. In response, he said that he had been given ten honorary doctorates and went on to say that In Ravi's homeland in India... honorary titles are commonplace and are often used out of respect for elders, including the R'SIM India team when addressing Ravi. The credibility of the alleged academic positions at the universities of Oxford and Cambridge has also been questioned. In a statement, RSIM stated that in previous years, Doctor did appear before Ravi's name in some of our materials, including on our website, which is a suitable and acceptable practice with honorary doctors. However, since this practice may be controversial in certain circles, we no longer use it. Today's Today reported that the online biography of zacharia has been edited following accusations of his credentials. Accusations of misconduct by Canadian Laurie Ann Thompson and her husband sent a letter to the accused of misconduct by the Canadian, asking him to pay \$5 million in exchange for abstaining from filing a lawsuit that would have accused zacharia of misconduct related to the exchange of texts between Laurie Ann Thompson and zacharia. The question is not whether I requested or sent any illegal photos or messages to her - I did not do so, and there is no evidence to the contrary, but whether I should have been willing to participate in any extended communication with the woman, not with my wife. The answer, I can unequivocally say no, and I totally take over . He added that was absolutely faithful to his wife Margie throughout their marriage, but admitted that he couldn't exercise wise caution and protect himself even from the appearance of misconduct. Four months after the death of mr. Sacharia in May 2020, three women who worked at the two-day resorts he owned in Atlanta have come forward with allegations that he sexually harassed several massage therapists for about five years. His former business partner regretted not stopping him and apologized to one of the alleged survivors; The international ministries of Ravi zacharia have denied these allegations and have launched a subsequent investigation. On May 7, 1972, he married Margaret Margie Reynolds, whom he met in his church's youth group. They had three children: Sarah, Nathan and Naomi. He lived in Atlanta, Georgia. In March 2020, he was diagnosed with malignant and rare spinal cancer, and on May 19, 2020, he died at his home in Atlanta at the age of 74. In the wake of his death, a number of high-ranking Christians posted messages on the internet detailing the influence of zacharia on them. White House press secretary Kayleigh McEnani and U.S. Vice President Mike Pence expressed their condolences to mr. Sacharia after his death.
