We taught Walk Through the Bible, New Testament, for the first time! We have run residentials, clubs, assemblies, lessons and more, all bringing faith within reach of the children and young people it is our privilege to work with! Back in March, we were blessed by a visit from two of our 'Mission Enablers' from the Scripture Union North Team; Rob and Lucy. They treated us to an evening called 'I Don't Go to Church, But...', where they unpacked some of Scripture Union's vision and strategy for the 95% of children and young people not in church attendance. Whilst the statistic can, at times, seem disappointing or overwhelming, one thing that struck us was the opportunity that this presents; this generation have fewer preconceived ideas about church and faith but many are open to spirituality and have lots of big questions about life. What a great position to start hearing about the difference that Jesus can make! Scripture Union are passionate about journeying alongside young people from outside of the church and have identified four common stages of the journey: Connect, Explore, Respond and Grow. As a Local Mission Partner of Scripture Union we are always trying to provide the opportunities for young people on the Isle of Man to connect with Christian peers and leaders; explore what it is all about; respond to Jesus and grow in faith. We are extremely fortunate to be trusted with opportunities to connect with lots of young people who do not go to church, whether for 20 minutes in an assembly or for a day at one of our curriculum events. With our office now based at Manor Ark in Pulrose, we have also taken every opportunity to connect with the community! A highlight this year was a Street Party that we organised, bringing together the whole estate in a fun-filled afternoon celebrating our wonderful But it doesn't stop there! For every connection that we make we want to make sure there is an opportunity, for those who are interested, to further explore what it is all about and, when they are ready, to respond and grow. With this in mind, we started two new 'Rooted' groups this year; 'Rooted Junior' (for 7-11 year olds in Pulrose) and 'Rooted Anime' (for teenagers interested in anime). Both started small but have facilitated good relationships with young people not in church and led to some great conversations about faith. The Rooted Junior group have been captivated by stories we have shared with them from the Bible and are so excited to come back It has certainly been a year of new things, ever since Kelly and Hannah joined our team in September... # Life Matters Isle of Man

#### How time flies...

SUMT have been running Life Matters on the Isle of Man for the last 10 years – That's right, since the days when these were considered high tech, and everyone knew how to use one!

One of Kelly's projects since joining our team in September has been taking over the reins of Life Matters, looking at it with fresh eyes and considering what we could do differently, without losing what makes this day so special.

In case you who don't know what Life Matters is, or would like a reminder, here is what Kelly has to say about it:

"Life Matters is an RE curriculum day providing an opportunity for Year 7 students at the start of their secondary school journey to spend time thinking about what matters to themselves and their peers, and to understand a bit more about what Christians believe. This event is packed with fun activities for the students, with great relationship building games as well as meaningful personal reflection time. The event is run by SUMT and supported by local churches and volunteers.

The event consists of four workshops that the students go through during the day, exploring different aspects of the Christian faith and their own personal values and beliefs. The four workshops are: Relationships, Communities, I (considering themselves) and Earth (all about the environment). We have had so much great feedback from last year's events, which has been helpful in refining

our design for LifeMatters as a day which is relevant, fun and valuable.

LifeMatters is such a wonderful opportunity for the Year 7s to spend time together doing something different, bonding as a year group while thinking about the important stuff in life. Schools have appreciated the event in terms of the content that is taught, and that it covers such a large part of the Christian component of the RE curriculum for the year. It's also a fantastic opportunity for volunteers, as it's an easy and hassle-free

way to get involved with youth work and give the students a wonderful day that they will remember for a long time.
All of the planning and prep is done, and volunteers can arrive on the day ready to get stuck in and have fun.

LifeMatters is coming up again in the new school year (September & October), and we are so excited to spend time with the new Year 7s on this fun day!"

#### A few words from Ruth...

"Twelve years. I have been on the Island and working with SUMT and the churches for twelve years!

When I moved here in 2010, after finishing university I came to do a gap year with SUMT and placed at the Cathedral, before I went back in to Biomed. After a few months it became clear that the Island and the work had captured my heart and I was going to stay longer.
