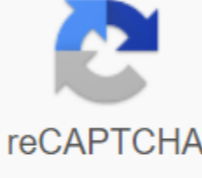

One of the biggest complaints from those migrating from Blackberry to android device should be email. We get used to doing things a certain way, and feel lost when things change. Even if you are not used to BlackBerry push mail this is a great method not only to get things more organized, but to save some battery as well. Join us after the break! Before we start, let's talk a little bit about push and pull by email. On your computer, you pull by email. You've created Outlook, Thunderbird or any other email program to check new email every x number of minutes. This can be done on your Android device as well by following the Master Setting for the mail app. It works great, and is easy to set up. It also uses more battery power. If you're like me, you use a heck of your Android phone and anything to help save the battery is good. That's where the email push comes in. This is because Google is pushing all Gmail towards you. When a new message appears in your Gmail inbox, you receive a notification automatically, just like when you receive a text message. We're going to use this to let Google check your POP email accounts and then send you a notification when it gets one. So you no longer have to check your new mail every X for a number of minutes, and it saves your battery! This great trick will work for any POP email account except Yahoo. To do this, I created a fictitious POP account through my ISP (Comcast) and a bogus Gmail account. Replace your pop account and Gmail account for my Of course. If you don't have a home computer, it can be easily done in the library or at the house of friends. Get your internet browser and switch to Gmail. In the plug and look for a link of settings in the top left. I highlighted it in the picture below, which you can click to zoom in. Go ahead and click on the link. It will open the settings area for your Gmail account. We are interested in bills and import tab. Once again, I highlighted it below and you can click to zoom in on the image. Once you open it, look for a button that says: Add a POP3 email account. This is the third button on top and in a section called Check Mail using POP3. Click on it and you get a small box that looks like the one below. In the input box you want to enter an email address that you would like to check for you. In the example, this is testmonkey@comcast.net. Replace this with your email address and then click Next Step. The window will change, very similar to the example below. Let me explain the settings here a bit. The username field will be the username of the POP account. In our example, it's testmonkey. Usually part of your email address is up to the sign I will be your username. The password field is the password you use to verify your POP account. It's just like you're checking your mail. The POP Server field is the online address of the POP mail server. This information is the same as if you were setting up a mail account on your computer. If you're not sure, a quick look at the help section of the website that posts your POP inbox should tell you. Usually it will be mail. Or pop. (don't forget the dots), then follow part of your email address that after the L. Port field is the port that the POP mail server uses to listen to incoming queries. This information can also be found from your pop help page email servers. If in doubt, set it at 110. This works for the vast majority of POP mail servers. Leave a copy of the message on the server. In our example, this has been tested. If you leave it unzable, the mail will be removed from your POP email account as soon as Gmail receives a copy of it. I like to leave them available so I can also check my mail from a laptop or even another phone. Warning - if you leave this box unzping, you won't be able to get mail from that account anywhere other than your Gmail account! Always use a secure connection (SSL) when receiving mail. If your email server IS POP so you use SSL to check your mail, check this box. If you are unsure, leave it out of control. In any case, if Selecting the wrong Gmail option will tell you when you click add your account and you can change it. Label incoming messages. Check this out and select your account tag. In our example it is unstoppable (see everyone make mistakes!), but you want to check it out. Archive of incoming messages (Skip mailbox). Checking this will keep mail collected from your POP account from appearing in your Gmail inbox. It will still show as unread, but will not mix with any mail sent you@gmail.com. You'll still be able to read it through the label settings (more on that later), so it's a personal choice. I like all my mail to come together in one mailbox, and also with separate mailboxes, so I left it out of control. If you have things configured, go ahead and click add account. You will be sent to the next screen, which you can view below. There's a choice to make. When you receive a message (in our case) testmonkey@comcast.net and decide to respond to it, from which account do you want to receive an answer? If you choose Yes, I want to be able to send email as a testmonkey@comcast.net any responses to email sent to testmonkey@comcast.net will show that email address as the sender. If you choose No, the answers seem to come from you@gmail.com. It's a matter of personal preference, but for this tutorial we want to send mail from the same address it was received, so we say yes. Once you decide, click the next step. You'll see the next window, just like below. Note that if you decide to pick the No above, you can skip until the rest of us catch up. The name field is the name you want to send mail from. Use your name instead of the Monkey test :). The link to indicate another address the response to is beyond the scope of this article and is used when collecting multiple accounts and want to reply from the account, in addition, which received the message. People who need it already know how to set it up. For the rest of us, just press the next step button and see the next window. This is another one of these settings for advanced users. For our purposes, we want to use outgoing Gmail servers to send our mail. Make sure you have to send through the gmail button chosen, and press the next step button to move forward. You wouldn't like it if I used your email address as a response when I email my son at school complaining about the recent increase in his car insurance. Google has thought about it and is forcing you to check your account before installing it. Click the Dispatch check button to move forward. On We need to check the email account we're trying to use using Gmail. DON'T CLOSE YOUR BROWSER WINDOWS OPEN. You have to go back and enter the code after you've got it in your POP POP Open your POP email and check the new message from the Gmail team. Open it. Above, I've highlighted the code that needs to be entered back into my Gmail account. You are also given the opportunity to click on the link to authorize it, but since we haven't quite done in Gmail we just enter the code manually. (Note - For those who like to do what they shouldn't, these account examples have already been deleted, so trying to use this information won't get you much good). Copy the code and head back to the Gmail window. Put your code in the box (don't use an example, each code is different) and click Check. The window will close and you will return to the settings for the email account. Click on the image below to check out our exampleMake sure that you have a dedicated section in our example marked in the settings. From now on, Gmail will regularly check the POP account you've just set up and send messages to your phone. We haven't done it though as we're going to create special mailboxes on our device to separate things. If you prefer everyone to go into the central mailbox, you may miss this part. Find a good empty space on your home screen, and give it a long press. You get a dialogue pop-up that looks like something like the one below. Note that mine may look different as I use the device with HTC Sense, so don't be alarmed that yours is not black. Click on the Shortcut selection and you'll see something close to the image below. We want to choose the Gmail label. This will open your phone's Gmail app to select the label you want to display. We'll choose Comcast, but you choose the one you just created. Go ahead and click on the name of the label you want to show and the window will disappear and you will return to your desktop. You will have a label directly in the mail with this label on your desktop as shown below. Once again, your icon may look different depending on which version of the Android operating system you use. Our example is the use of Cupcake. Now, if you click on a new icon, you'll be delivered to the Gmail app, but you'll only see the mail that came into your POP account. We have another pic below to check out our example. Since I didn't tell Gmail to bypass the mailbox, I also have a mailbox label there. If you don't decide to combine them, you won't have one. You can add shortcuts to as many shortcuts as you like. Here's an image of a few in action, but wait! We're not done yet. Having labels and mailboxes is good, but what if we don't want to take up so much space? Why put them in a folder, of course! Long click the empty area of the home screen again, but this time choose You'll see a screen change to resemble the example below. We want to choose a new folder, so click on it. The window will close and you will return to your desk with Icon. Oddly enough, it's called Folder. Well, of course it won't work. Allows you to change his name. Click the folder icon to open it. An empty window, similar to the image below, will open. Note that the front bar of the window is also called Folder. To change it, click on the front bar box. A new window will open that will allow us to set the name as we would like. In our example we'll call it MailboxesHit OK and you'll be dumped back on your desktop. Please note that the name of the folder has been changed. Now click on one of your email tags and drag it into the Mailbox folder after it becomes mobile. Once you're over the mailbox, let go. The Gmail icon will be disappointed, but don't worry. Now it's in the folder. You can move all the mail tags to the folder. Now hit the folder icon again and look inside. Now try it. Open the Gmail app and send a new email to your newly created account. Give it a few minutes and when you get a new mail indicator, click on the label you just created and you'll see it sitting there waiting for you. This trick can be done with as many POP email accounts as you would like. I use it to check and deliver my mail to three other accounts. When you add up energy savings from having to check and pull out of three other bills every 15 minutes, it gets to be pretty significant. You should know that this does not make mail delivery instantaneous. Gmail checks your POP accounts on a set schedule in 15 minutes or so. Once it gets on Google's email server, it is pushed directly to you. I hope you found it useful, just like me, and what you enjoyed this week inside Android.
