First, an artist creates a small-scale version of the design. To create a pattern, measurements are taken from the actual window space. The pattern is transferred to paper, cardboard, or even a large table, where the space will be filled later with glass. A full-size drawing, called a cartoon, is then prepared in black and white. The cutting line (exact plotting of lead lines) and pattern drawings are made with this caricature. The colored glass is cut into the shapes in the pattern and painted if necessary. Once all the pieces are cut, they are joined with strips of grooved lead, known as cames, which are then welded together.
