The Camino de Santiago; known in English as the Way of St James, is a network of pilgrims' ways or pilgrimages leading to the shrine of the apostle Saint James the Great in the cathedral of Santiago de Compostela in Galicia in north-western Spain, where tradition holds that the remains of the apostle are buried. As Pope Benedict XVI said, "It is a way sown with so many demonstrations of fervour, repentance, hospitality, art and



culture which speak to us eloquently of the spiritual roots of the Old Continent." Many follow its routes as a form of spiritual path or retreat for their spiritual growth. It is also popular with hiking and cycling enthusiasts and organized tour groups. Created and established after the discovery of the relics of Saint James the Great at the beginning of the 9th century, the Way of St James became a major pilgrimage route of medieval Christianity from the 10th

century onwards. But it was only after the capture of Granada in 1492, under the reign of Ferdinand II of Aragon and Isabella I of Castile, that Pope Alexander VI officially declared the Camino de Santiago to be one of the "three great pilgrimages of Christendom", along with Jerusalem and Rome. Two of our parishioners Dave & Teri Morris with relatives from American completed the pilgrimage last month. Below is the thoughts of Dave & Teri on the expereince

Dave: I found walking the final 3 stages of the Camino a very profound experience. The weather suited us for walking (about 25 km/day) in that in early Oct it's neither too hot or too wet. As we put one foot in front of the other, day after day, you had great time and space to get a new



perspective on where you are in your life. And of course, the spiritual element was always in the background, as we walked in the footsteps of the countless Pilgrims who trod this path before us all down the centuries, each bearing their own bundle of cares to lay at the feet of the Apostle James in the Cathedral in Santiago de Compostela.

A magnificent place of worship, and we felt privileged to attend Mass there at our journey's end.

<u>Teri:</u> The Camino has been on our bucket list for some time. We booked our trip in 2020 to celebrate our 30th Wedding Anniversary and 60th birthdays for both Dave and myself. We planned to walk between 120 (60+60) to 150 (120+30) kms. But covid scuppered our plans and we didn't get going until this year. In the end we did 117 kms in 5 days. It was one of the most wonderful experiences ever. I couldn't believe we had so much fun. My cousins from America (Jack & Sissy) joined us.

We spent each day much the same: getting up, having a Galacian breakfast, walking for most of the day with a nice break in between for lunch, resting then having a local meal for dinner. We met people from all over the world and everyone was so friendly. 'Buen Camino' was the greeting we received and gave in return. It was a great way to get close to mother earth being outdoors for most of the day, and to solve the world's problems at the same time chatting as we navigated the path. And when the day ended, and the final km walked, we all had a wonderful sense of accomplishment and a feeling that we had done something special.

Statement Read to Churches prepared by Canon Ian

As most of you know, over the past eighteen months, my wife Donna has faced health issues resulting in her moving back North to be with family, just before Easter. Due to my sense of belonging in the Parishes of Killanne & Killegney Union, and wider parish and diocesan commitments, it was felt that I should stay here continuing relations with Donna and the family, through media calls and visits. The reality was also, the unlikely possibility of me gaining a Parish closer to home. To my utter surprise however I received an invitation to consider the vacancy in Carrickmacross Group of Parishes, County Monaghan in Clogher Diocese. Sharing the news with my family of the interest from Carrickmacross, I was unprepared for the depth of response especially the tears of my grown daughters. I have been here for five years, and different people will view that time in different ways. A long time, a short time, a time of maintaining, a time of growth, a time of loss. But to my wee girls it was a long difficult time for them, and now I am beginning to appreciate how stressful it has been for them. After meeting with the parish and diocesan nominators they have offered me the opportunity to take up the position which I have accepted. Because of the parishioners I have met from Carrickmacross I am looking forward to my next stage of ministry, taking with me the riches I have gained from County Wexford, the sunny southeast. The move will take place sometime well into the new year.
