She was given this name by her mother, Tina Knowles, whose daughter-in-law's name was Beyoncé (pronounced as bay-AND-say). Allegedly, Tina chose to give her daughter this name as a way to let her child continue the family name as there weren't enough men in the family to do so. Both Beyoncé and Beyoncé have the meaning from outside others. Since Beyoncé's name came from her mother's s last name, which was already very rare, of course, it wasn't a very popular name to have. Queen Bey, however, managed to influence more parents to give their children this beautiful name. In 1999, the Social Security Administration reported that there were 18 births called Beyoncé and that number rose to 253 in 2001. Since then, there have been nearly 2,000 people named Beyoncé. They were born mostly women between 2000 and 2004. Beyoncé also gave her children very meaningful names Beyoncé married rapper and business mogul Jay-Z in 2008. The couple has three children. With a moniker like Beyoncé, it seemed obvious that Queen Bey wasn't going to settle on common names for her kids. Her first child, Blue Ivy (b. 2012), has two meanings for her name. The first meaning relates to the colour blue and its meaning in life. Beyoncé once shared an excerpt from the book *A Field Guide to Getting Lost* by Rebecca Solnit on her social media page about the color blue: The world is blue on the edge and in its depths... the light that gets lost gives us the beauty of the world, so much of which is in the color blue. Although it is not clear where the Ivy is part of, it is widely believed to be a reference to the Roman umeral IV, which is four. That makes sense since four is a special number for both Beyoncé and Jay-Z. Beyoncé's birthday is on September 4 while Jay-Z's fall on December 4. Meanwhile, their wedding anniversary is on April 4. The number is so significant that Beyoncé also tattooed it on one of her fingers. Aside from Blue Ivy, Beyoncé and Jay-Z have twins named Rumi and Sir (b. 2017). Rumi is their daughter and she is named after a 13th-century Persian poet who holds the couple. Sir, their son, is not named after anyone special. Instead, Jay-Z revealed that little Sir name basically described how he came out in the world. Sir was like, man, coming out of the Jay-Z said. He carries himself that way. He just came out, like Sir. While her kids barely have names, the influence of Beyoncé has made these monikers a little more popular. It has been reported that there was an increase in baby girls called Ivy in 2012 and after, probably because of Blue Ivy being born.
