About Encaustic Painting

"What captivates me about encaustic painting is the surface. The painting seems more like a construction, a play of light, with a surface you want to touch. I use the encaustic painting to highlight my drawing. Added texture, luminosity, layers, and dimension aid in my construction or building of my artwork. I add, and take away, sometimes making the painting more of a sculptural form. The carving away is another form of drawing. You have to see it and touch it to understand. It is the back and forth nature of collage that lends itself well to encaustic painting. Collage elements add more texture, dimension and depth to the paintings." --Marcie Wolf-Hubbard
