PM Harper's comments on good governance came after he criticised opposition parties' failure to call the House of Commons into session. (Adrian Wyld/Canadian Press) The Conservative government's latest attacks on the opposition's refusal to call a parliamentary session could prove costly for the government's majority, according to a new poll. The Nanos Research poll for the Angus Reid Institute released Thursday found that nearly half of respondents said the opposition's decision to block a second session of the House of Commons in less than three weeks was a political mistake. Twenty-five per cent said the

decision was a mistake, while 29 per cent said they didn't know. The Conservatives have been in a battle with the opposition over the session. Prime Minister Stephen Harper has criticized the opposition parties for not calling the House into session. On Monday, Harper called on opposition parties to put forward bills and force the government to debate them. The opposition is demanding that the House of Commons return and vote on key pieces of legislation before a budget bill is brought in. "We will meet the opposition's bill with our own bill, then we will sit in the House of Commons and ask for votes," Harper said. "If we're going to debate the budget, we'll have to have a House of Commons, where they have to debate our bill." However, when the House of Commons reconvenes on Feb. 25, it will be less than three weeks since the government survived a no-confidence vote in which more than 50 Liberal and NDP MPs helped sink the government. "A lot of the calls to break up the government in the House of Commons will have to wait until after the session ends in April," Angus Reid said in a news release. "A good majority of Canadians have a very negative view of the current government." Nanos Research president 520fdb1ae7
