A TASTE OF FRANCE



Michael Pettit and Ashley Yenor, our French teachers, took their French 2 classes to the Detroit Institute of Arts (DIA) for a guided tour in late October after finishing a lesson on French art, including art vocabulary, critiquing works, French artists, and the influential movements that happened in France. The small group tours culminated in a goose chase (scavenger hunt) to find the masterpieces of the French artists our students studied. The group also experienced a three-course French lunch at Cuisine,

a fine-dining restaurant in Detroit, where Chef Paul Grosz presented lobster bisque, beef bourguignon, sea bass, mushroom risotto, and a tarte au citron. Tres manifique!

PREP LANGUAGE TEACHER MICHAEL PETTIT: SHARING FOREIGN LANGUAGE LEARNING

I recently presented at the Michigan World Language Association conference in Lansing on the topic of

how to create a strong classroom community, one that provides students with a sense of belonging, and a shared commitment to succeeding in the class. In world language classes, this has the added benefit of allowing students to comfortably and voluntarily try using the target language (French). I then talked about specific strategies used to create and strengthen classroom community, including using surveys to get student input, in-class interviews (in the target language) to have students and teachers get to know each other, routines to create a bond, and reading together as a class.







ST. JOHN PAUL II LITURGICAL CENTER UPDATE

In December, we celebrate the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ. However, Christmas is preceded by another important solemnity, that of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, on December 8th. This year, it is the 170th anniversary of the proclamation of the Dogma of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary proclaimed on December 8th, 1854, by Pope Pius IX. Let us read some excerpts from the St. John Paul II homily delivered 20 years ago (Dec. 8th, 2004):

How great is the mystery of the Immaculate Conception that the Liturgy presents to us today! A mystery that never ceases to invite the contemplation of believers and inspires the reflection of theologians. The theme of the Congress that has just been mentioned: "Mary of Nazareth welcomes the Son of God into history", has fostered a deep examination of the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception of Mary as a presupposition for receiving in her virginal womb the Word of God Incarnate, the Saviour of the human race.

"Full of grace", "κεχαριτωμευη": in the original Greek of Luke's Gospel, the Angel greets Mary with this title. It is the name that God, through his messenger, chose to use to describe the Virgin. This is how he had always seen and thought of her, ab aeterno (from all eternity).

In the hymn of the Letter to the Ephesians just now proclaimed, the Apostle praises God the Father "who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places" (1:3). What a special blessing God addressed to Mary from the beginning of time! Mary was truly blessed among women (cf. Lk 1:42)!

The Father chose her in Christ before the creation of the world, so that she might be holy and immaculate before him in love, preordaining her as the first fruits of filial adoption through the work of Jesus Christ (cf. Eph 1:4-5). The predestination of Mary, like that of each one of us, is linked to the predestination of the Son. Christ is that "seed" that was "to bruise the head" of the ancient serpent, according to the Book of Genesis (cf. Gn 3:15); he is the Lamb "without blemish" (cf. Ex 12:5; I Pt 1:19), immolated to redeem humanity from sin.

With a view to the saving death of the Son, Mary, his Mother, was preserved free from original sin and from every other sin. The victory of the new Adam also includes that of the new Eve, Mother of the redeemed. The Immaculate Virgin is thus a sign of hope for all the living who have triumphed over Satan by the blood of the Lamb (cf. Rv 12:11). Today let us contemplate the humble young girl of Nazareth, holy and blameless before God in love (cf. Eph 1: 4), in that "love" whose original source is God himself, one and triune.

THE TRADITION OF POLISH CHRISTMAS EVE

Christmas traditions in Poland are full of magic and meaning. The customs have been passed down through the centuries and are deeply rooted in religion, family, and nature.

Christmas Eve is one of the most celebrated holidays in Poland and it comes with many traditions and folk tales. Wigilia (Christmas Eve) is a lavish, full feast that ends the Advent season and must start after spotting the first Christmas star. The dining table traditionally has an extra seat for the unexpected visitor and the feast ends with Pasterka (Midnight Mass) which is attended by the whole family regardless of age.





In addition

to these traditions, Wigilia is also known for its 12 meatless dishes. Why 12? It is because the 12 dishes represent the 12 apostles of Jesus and the 12 months of the year. Since meat is not allowed prior to midnight on Christmas Eve, another strict tradition in Poland, all 12 dishes are a feast for vegetarians and fish loving Poles. Trying all 12 dishes is considered good luck and assurance that nobody will run out of food the following year.

The dishes are spectacular

and prepared with the finest ingredients and extra love. Must-have dishes include: Pierniki (Polish gingerbread cookies), czerwony barszcz (red borscht), zupa grzybowa (mushroom soup), kapusta z grochem (cabbage with peas), sałatka (potato salad), karp (carp fish), sledzie (herring), pierogi (Polish dumplings), sernik (Polish cheesecake), kutia (wheat and honey dessert), makowiec (poppy seed cake) and kompot (cooked fruit punch).

Sharing opłatek (Polish wafer for Christmas) is another must. It is time for good wishes, hugs, and kisses from loved ones. Caroling is also a great tradition in Poland and makes the evening even more festive. The opening of Christmas gifts usually starts after supper and is one of the most anticipated events for the little ones on Christmas Eve.

It has been said that how one spends Christmas Eve is how one's entire year will be. So, it is customary to be calm, relaxed, and genuinely nice to be around.


glass art, traditional folk costumes, and an award-winning szopka loaned from supporters of FPA. This multi-faced international exploration of creative traditions is not to be missed!


UNWAVERING DEDICATION OF OUR ALUMNI RELATIONS OFFICERS
