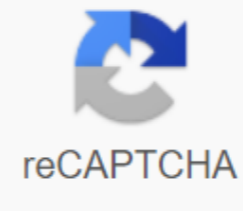

When the Mavericks first came out as a big company with IT policy and security, we couldn't just switch to a new OS without testing things first. We've had some and customers in the marketing and ops store who needed iMovie for their work, but we could not install because of the same problem. We even called our Apple support contacts and said sorry sorry Not good. Upgrade to Mavericks or tough. They couldn't even help us if we threw money at them. We had to end up actually just downloading a copy from a torrent site for the user. It's absolutely ridiculous that we had no choice but to go back to what some might consider piracy. I find it a little hard to believe that no one with where, to support Apple had a copy of the previous iMovie they could send us considering how much we would spend on leasing computers. Vuala, it can be done. What I learned: Previous versions of iLife can only be obtained through the drive, not through the App Store, apparently. The same thing happens with everything that came up to the App Store. What I read online leads me to believe otherwise, but not with my operating system (Lion).
