They are all designed to match what children learn in school. In your child's annual group area, you'll find a pack of weekly activities for English and maths. In some cases, it is complemented by appropriate video resources; including teaching videos at Oak National Academy. There is also a need for work on history, geography and science - but note that it may not be updated every week. Rather, the idea is that activities that are set to involve two weeks' worth of work (the maximum period that the child would normally need to be isolated).
