The 24-hour prayer chain is designed to be prayed for long periods of time, as guided by the Holy Spirit, for those who are seeking earnest prayers from the brethren. Jeremiah 42:2 ... And he said to Jeremiah the prophet, Let our request come before you and pray for us to the LORD your God, who is for all this remnant; for we are left only a few of many left, as your eyes now see us, 1 Kings 13:6 The king said to the man of God, Please ask the LORD your God, and pray for me, that my hand may be restored to me. And the man of God asked the LORD, and the king's hand was restored to him, and it was as it was before. 17 Elijah was a man like us. He prayed earnestly that it would not rain, and it did not rain in the country for three and a half years.... If you want to join the prayer chain... Please fill in the form below. The goal is to involve the Church in personal and communal prayer and to experience the power and blessings of the Holy Ghost: You too, as living stones, are built as a spiritual house for a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ 1 Peter 2:5 How does it work? It's simple: you simply register for an hour slot (or more) and commit to the Lord to pray during that time. This can be at home or wherever you are, alone, in your family, with a partner or friends. How do I register? By filling out the form below at IBC, down in the Fellowship Hall after the service. How do you pray for an hour? You can divide your hour into different time frames: time to read a special, inspirational verse or writing section time to listen to the Lord and meditate on the verse or passage time for confession time for personal request for your needs time for intercession for another time for a song in the glory of God. The next 24-hour prayer starts at 08:00 on the Saturday of the weekend of the first Sunday of the month. Meanwhile, there is a video that inspires you to join the 24-hour prayer movement: REGISTER Your PRAYER ROOM Wondering how to begin non-stop prayer in your community? Follow these 5 simple steps to get stuck in: 1. Collect a group Find others to pray with –your church community, local Christian friends, student group, mission team, work colleagues, or whoever God has placed around you. The strength of the community - people who are together – is the most important thing when you start a 24-7 prayer adventure. Collect your group, share your vision and start. 2. Choose a time Choose how long And when you want to pray –is there a specific period or significant opportunity for your community? When does a reasonable time to pray feel like? Many people choose to start a week of uninterrupted prayer, but choose what feels best for your group. Give everyone a lot of attention and prepare to pray. Register your 24-7 prayer room so that we can support you along the way! 3. Find a place Find somewhere accessible 24 hours a day that can fit how many people you think will pray at once. We have heard of people praying in churches, tents, caravans, trucks, shops, cellars – so don't feel restricted! Find a place that works for your community or friendship group. 4. Think creative 24-7 prayer rooms provide a space for people to connect with God in different ways, so think about the box! Add materials for people to paint and draw their prayers; promotion and promotion activities; suggested things for which one can pray. The goal is to involve the whole heart and the whole Spirit in the connection with God. Break your time from 24-7 prayer into one-hour slots and ask people to sign up – you will receive an online tool or sign-up template after registering your prayer room. Every prayer room I have visited has only fueled my heart for a deeper encounter with God and renewed the hope that even greater things will come. Any discussion of prayer chains must begin with the Moravian Pietists of the 18th century, led by Count von Zinzendorf. This non-denominational community consisted of Moravia (believers from the Czech region) and other persecuted refugees from the Protestant wars who came to Zinzendorf's estate in Germany to obtain asylum. This small community experienced a powerful revival, and within two weeks of the Twenty-four men and twenty-four women committed themselves to praying hourly intercessions, praying 24 hours a day. They undertook to ensure that the fire must constantly burn on the altar; it must not go out (Leviticus 6:13). This prayer meeting would be non-stop for the next hundred years and is seen by many as the spiritual force behind many revivals of the eighteenth, nineteenth, and twentieth years. Viewed. The Moravia served as an example and inspiration for Peter Greig and the modern 24/7 prayer movement. After a visit to Herrhut, the historical site of the municipality of Zinzendorf, Greig said: If the Moravia could do a century of 24/7 prayer, we could try it for at least a month in our church at home. So they started their experiment in September 1999 and found that they couldn't stop praying after the month was over and continued until Christmas. Today there are thousands of 24/7 prayer rooms in over seventy countries and counts. Prayer escalates. Usually it starts to pray with only a few individuals who feel the burden. They begin to pray for an awakening on their campus, in their church, on their city. The more they pray, the greater the burden. Unable to bear it alone, they need others to carry the burden with them. So they call others to mix their hearts and prayers with them. God then touches these new participants, and they too are set on fire. They then recruit others. So the numbers that pray passionately are increasing. Sooner or later, a critical mass of prayer, of the ardent believers, gathers. Like a nuclear reaction (where molecules of radioactive material are continuously added until a certain mass is reached) when a certain number (known only to God) is reached by fervently praying believers, a spiritual explosion occurs. God then sends a comprehensive movement to touch the campus, church, or city, to resuscitate the faithful and to awaken unbelievers so that they can convert. Your prayer chain cannot turn into a massive revival or last 100 years, in fact 24 hours would be quite an achievement and a pretty visionary goal. SOME BASIC HOW-TO'S Whether you are forming a prayer chain for a specific event or a longer period of time, the following are some helpful suggestions. Plan a time when you can challenge others to join a prayer chain. You can do this at a weekly prayer meeting, a small group, or a weekly meeting with larger groups. Explain clearly what is expected of everyone who participates in the prayer chain. What are they committing to? Determine how long the prayer times will be. We would suggest 15 minutes of time slots. Then determine how many of these time windows you want people to sign in. Do you want them to sign up for 1 time window, 3 time windows, etc.? It is not necessary that you have covered every 24 hours of the day. Determine the hours of the days at which the prayer chain should be active at specific times of the day because they are in class. Prepare volunteers who can fill them in for their prayer engagement. Let the cards match the different prayer times available. In this way, they fill out a card for a specific prayer time and you will not have overlap. You may want them to provide their e-mail address, They can remind them of their commitment and/or send them updated prayer requests that they can use during their prayer times. Prepare another set of cards to remind the volunteers of their commitment. Record everyone's engagement on a master prayer chain card. Consider sending prayer requests regularly by email to everyone in the chain. It would also be good to update your chain to God's answers to their prayers. ATMOSPHERE If possible, to name and set up a prayer room on campus. This would be a place where everyone can pray at any time, a place where the twenty-four-hour prayer can continue unabated if people are willing and committed. Be creative in setting up the environment of the room, with copies of visionary articles, prayer diaries, books, music, lists of requests and stories of answered prayer. Create an environment where people can come day and night and find a sanctuary to seek the Lord and pray for the needs of service, campus, and the world. Use this as a place to hold your weekly prayer times and have a war room to set up prayer chains: 24/7 prayer clocks for campus.
