Ashlawn School has undergone several changes since its inception in 1952 as Dunsmore School for Girls. The school's first headmistress, Miss Kathleen Hughes, played a pivotal role in shaping the institution. Following its expansion to include a boys' school in 1958, Ashlawn merged with Fareham High School in 1985 to form the current Ashlawn School. Throughout its history, Ashlawn has received various accolades and upgrades. In 2005, it was granted Special Science College status, enabling the school to acquire modern educational equipment such as portable tablets with internet access. The school's Leadership College status, awarded in 2009, further solidified its reputation. Ashlawn has also made significant investments in sustainability, including the installation of solar panels on several buildings and planning for a wind turbine project. In 2013, the school opened a bespoke expressive arts centre, marking a milestone in its commitment to community engagement. The Education Funding Agency awarded Ashlawn with £2.6 million in 2015 to build a Sixth Form Centre and specialist Teaching Studio. This development underscores the school's ongoing efforts to enhance its facilities and provide high-quality educational experiences for its students. Ashlawn School has seen a significant surge in demand for placements. In 2016, the school was recognized as one of the UK's top state schools by Tatler Magazine, based on GCSE and A level results. However, in January 2023, the CEO of TLET announced that Mrs Evans, the Principal, would be leaving her role with immediate effect, replaced by Paul Brockwell as Associate Principal. In November 2022, an Ofsted inspection led to Ashlawn School being downgraded from Outstanding to Inadequate. The report highlighted several areas for improvement, including behavior and attitudes, lack of courtesy and respect, and the school's culture. Additionally, the provision for pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) was identified as requiring improvement. In 2010, the Secretary of Education approached the school about becoming an Academy. In 2011, the school took on Academy status and joined the Transforming Lives Educational Trust family of schools. The trust operates several schools, including Henry Hinde Infant School, Henry Hinde Junior School, and Houlton School. In 2018, Headteacher Lois Reed received a significant pay increase, bringing her salary to £270,000-£280,000. While some defended the decision, others deemed it "obscene" and "ridiculous." Following Reed's resignation, Siobhan Evans was announced as her replacement from January 2019. The school has a strong alumni network, with notable graduates including professional golfer Lauren Taylor and science fiction author Michael John Harrison.
