Few people can read the entire passage and answer all the questions in this passage in less than 18 minutes. You need the ability to read a question, understand meaning, identify keywords, and find that information in a passage in less than two minutes. Even if you understand and knowing where to look, it can still be difficult to determine what information is important to help you answer the question. When you work through these short passages, you can answer based on the type of question. Each passage will be followed by a single and predictable question. But I can't stress it enough.... Don't forget to challenge yourself by setting a timer. And keep in mind that some TOEFL questions take longer than others.
