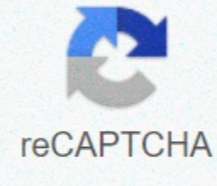

The epilogue is titled February 12, 1973. Patriot Games - It begins in 1981 and runs until the summer of 1982 based on a reference to Ryan's age, which is 31 at the beginning of the novel. It roughly fits the First Child of the Princess of Wales, who is a boy and a few months old, since the birth of Prince William in 1982. The discrepancies include a reference to the van, which is likely to have a year of production in 1984. Red Rabbit's subsequent events seem to push his date back to 1981 rather than 1982. Red Rabbit - Presumably begins in the spring of 1982 as Jack Ryan Jr.'s age in the novel is given as 5 months, although the main action clearly begins on August 15. Clear and present danger - 1988. The book refers to Jack's age as 40. Troops are being sent to Colombia to fight the Medellín cartel and limit drug supplies to America. The sum of all fears - 1990-1991. The book appears after the Gulf War and before the dissolution of the Soviet Union. It is suggested that both events occur at the same time in ryan's universe as in the actual case in 1991. Earlier chapters state that almost two Novembers have passed since the election of President Fowler, which began in 1990. The rainbow six video game puts atomic detonation in Denver, as it did in 1989. Honorary Debt - 1995-1996. The end of the book comes eleven months before the president's inauguration in 1997. Interesting, but not relevant to the plot of this or any further book is that North and South Korea were said to be united at some point between the Sum of All Fears and this book. The Teeth of the Tiger - 2006, based on the age of Jack Ryan Jr., the U.S. is now engaged in a global war on terrorism in response to the 9/11 attacks that took place in Ryan's universe, as it did in the real world. At the end of the last novel, he is re-elected and defeated. J. Robert Fowler, a former Ohio governor who defeats the incumbent at the end of Clear and Present Danger and is in office during Sum of All Fears. After his failure to deal with the Denver crisis almost leads to nuclear war, he resigns at the end of the novel. Roger Durling, Fowler's vice president, former Governor of California and Vietnam veteran serving in the 82nd Division Durling replaces Fowler when he resigns, and is president of debt honor. Almost he Fowler's tenure as president and he plans to campaign for re-election when he is killed along with most of the government when a Japanese jet is smashed into the Capitol building. John Patrick Ryan is confirmed as Durling's new vice president at the end of Debt of Honor and is sworn in as president when Durling is assassinated the same day. His claim to the presidency is disputed by durling's former vice president Ed Kealty in Executive Orders, but the courts ultimately rule in Ryan's favor. He is mentioned during the Rainbow Six, though he never appears and is portrayed as the President in Bear and Dragon. Ryan does not want to run for re-election between the events of The Bear and The Dragon and The Teeth of The Tiger. Robby Jackson: After Ryan decides not to run for re-election, he resigns before his term ends ryans. Robby Jackson is murdered during the campaign six days before Election Day. Edward Jonathan Kealty: Former Vice President Durling replaced by Jack Ryan after sex scandal When cumbent President Robby Jackson is assassinated during the campaign, Kealty is elected president in his own right, a position he holds in Tiger Teeth, Dead or Alive, and Locked On. John Patrick Ryan, : Begins his campaign for re-election at dead or alive events, defeats Kealty by a narrow margin in Locked On and takes office before the events of Threat Vector. He is portrayed as president in all subsequent Ryanverse novels. Various books include references to both President Reagan and the George H.W. Bush Presidency, as if it happened to campus starting with tiger teeth, Ryanverse's novel features an off-the-books campus intelligence organization while featuring Jack Ryan, Sr. as a more background character. They follow his son Jack Ryan Jr. and colleagues on several counterterrorism missions. Hendley Associates, a private trading and arbitration firm, serves as a legal cover for the organization or white party.
