He is the author of more than ten books and editor of twenty-five volumes on emerging development issues, and has been a frequent author of literary magazines on regional planning, urban and rural development and environmental issues. A multi-national comparative study on regional development, which he conducted as a result of work on rural development: capitalist and socialist paths in five volumes (Concept, 1985). Professor Misra currently heads the department of geography of the Delhi School of Economics, Delhi, in addition to being the director of Gandhi Bhavan, Delhi University, and Chairman of the IGU Commission for International Division of Labour and Regional Development A. Ramesh is a professor and head of the geographical faculty of madras University. He has been teaching cartography to P.G. students for more than twenty years. He was President of the Indian National Mapping Association (1985-86), Vice President of the International Geographical Union's Commission on Health Geography, and a member of the National Committee on Geography, India, and the Institute of Surveys, India.
