If you see a group of words in a sentence that works adverb, but has no subject or verb, it is an adverb of the phrase. Using an adverb position in a sentence is a good way to add important, descriptive details and information to your letter. They are flexible and can be placed at the beginning, middle or end of the sentence, depending on where it sounds best.
