A Message from our Co-Founders

s it was for so many Aothers, 2021 was one of the most challenging years we've faced - but it also showcased our team's tremendous dedication and resolve in the face of adversity. The second year of the COVID-19 pandemic made it nearly impossible for patients to travel for surgical care in other countries, or for surgical teams to provide care in Haiti - but still, we navigated complex visa and quarantine requirements to secure care for thirteen children with the most urgent need. Along with COVID. an ongoing epidemic of kidnapping and insecurity, including the assassination of the president, plagued Haiti throughout the year, creating further difficulties both for our team personally and also for our patients traversing rough areas to get to care - and vet we succeeded in providing outpatient diagnosis and medical care to

over 700 of our patients. Even as other NGOs scaled back their work, we redoubled our efforts to get passports for as many patients and parents as possible in the hopes of a brighter 2022 with many more surgeries possible. A silver lining to this terrible cloud is that our telemedicine capacities have allowed our team to really function on its own with collaborative diagnostic work from our doctors in the United States.

As we emerge from the most difficult days of the pandemic, we are launching new efforts to provide life-saving care to more patients than ever before in our history. We're inspired by the steadfast support and notes of encouragement from so many of you during the past two years, and we look forward to sharing many patients' stories of survival and healing during the coming year!
