Do I need a voter ID?

In Missouri, you need a valid, unexpired photo ID to vote. Acceptable photo identification includes:

- Missouri driver's license or state ID, U.S. passport, Military photo ID, including a veteran ID card
- You can get a free photo ID at any [Missouri Department of Revenue](#) license office or by calling 573-526-VOTE (8683).
- If you don't have an ID when you're at your polling location, you can fill out a provisional ballot. Should you cast a provisional ballot, you will receive instructions on how to verify that your vote was counted.

How do I vote in person?

- Polling places often include schools, libraries and recreational centers across the region.
- St. Louis residents can vote at any of the 50 polling locations in the city. Several surrounding counties also have online tools to help you look up your polling place - including St. Louis County, St. Charles County and Jefferson County.

How can I vote early?

- ❖ **St. Louis residents** can vote early without providing an excuse at these locations, beginning July 21.
