The four-week block was organised by the Hamilton Area Community Learning and Home School Partnership at Whitehill Community Centre.

Youngsters enjoyed a wide range of activities aimed at developing their skills in science, technology and maths.

And they spent the last session learning basic electronics and building a project with help from the CQScotland Group, which helps offer lessons in amateur radio and electronics.

The children enjoyed viewing a collection of radio equipment and learning about Morse, secret codes, spying and communication methods, and even made their own Morse senders to take home.
